

CALLED TO WITNESS

In the aftermath of Jesus' salvific death and resurrection, the early believers called upon a variety of witnesses to attest to that event whereby their lives were forever changed. First but not foremost among these witnesses was the empty tomb. The emptiness of the tomb that Joseph of Arimathea had provided for the burial of Jesus invited various interpretations even among the disciples. Those who first came upon the tomb thought that someone had moved the body. Only with the further clarification of an angel interpreter on an experience of the risen Jesus was the witness understood. Others among Jesus' disciples thought the tomb was empty because the body of Jesus had been stolen; some non-disciples and detractors of Jesus assumed that His disciples had taken the body and hidden it in order to propagate the "myth" of His rising.

Witnesses who experienced Jesus in His risen glory offered some of the most powerful testimony. These attested to having seen Jesus in various places throughout Judah; He spoke with them and ate with them. He showed his wounds and enabled them to begin to see that God's promise of salvation had been fulfilled in Him. He assured them that He would remain with them through the abiding presence of the bread and in the word. These witnesses to Jesus were instrumental in drawing others to believe and in causing the Jesus-movement to grow and to spread beyond Judah throughout the then-known world.

Too soon, however, these eyewitnesses to the historical as well as to the risen Jesus were silenced by their own passage through death of life. Witnesses to the risen Christ, therefore, became the special privilege and responsibility of the community of believers. We become reacquainted with the earliest members of our community during the Easter Season. In our first reading, St. Luke reminds us that the first disciples were characterized by a unity of mind and heart. Christian unity did not demand conformity; on the contrary, differences were to be respected and even reverenced as the community grew and its complexion changed.

The early Christians bore powerful witness to their contemporaries by their mutual caring and sharing and by their willingness to forgive and work toward the reconciliation of all peoples in Christ.

These early witnesses and the testimony we revisit year after year should not be simply a glimpse at the "good old days" or at a bygone era that is now passé or too impractical and unrealistic for the 21st century believers. On the contrary, these witnesses and the lives they lived challenge us. Their idealism begs to be reflected in us. Their courage urges us not to allow our tentative efforts to falter or our pessimism to hold us back or our desire to be politically correct to delete or extinguish altogether our best efforts at living the Gospel. God forbid that we might look foolish or naïve in our hoping and in our caring. Although it may be tempting to "beg off" because we are so busy or overwhelmed at the enormity of the world's needs or because there are agencies and people who are being paid to take care of such things, these early witnesses will not allow us to shirk or ignore the ministry that they have begun. Their ministry has become our own.
