Pastor's END OF LIFE DECISION - CONFUSION

In place of my weekly article under "Pastor's Corner," I share with you this weekend an article prepared by Izabella Jakab, a Doctor of Internal Medicine, a parishioner, and Parish Eucharistic Minister.

Lately, there seems to be a lot of confusion regarding end of life decision-making. Unfortunately, this is because we lost our spiritual, Godly perspective, and we no longer identify with the traditional Christian principles. The decision should be God's, but we try to take control, and that leads to confusion. We forget that life is a gift from God, sacred from conception to natural death. The timing of natural death is God's, not man's. A larger dose of morphine, pulling a feeding tube, and starvation are NOT natural death. (Unfortunately today this happens in many nursing homes, more or less undercover.) Today, "compassion and dignity" have a different meaning. A dog is put down when old and suffering, but a dog is not a spiritual being like you or I. Persons have souls in their old, ravaged, and tired bodies. It is easy to forget that when watching an old grandmother with Alzheimer's disease, dependent on everyone else's compassion, for every drop of water. We do not know how much redemption just one more day of quiet suffering can bring to her or her family. Suffering is not wasted by God. The quality of life of that person is defined by its redemptive value it can bring. We are no judge of THAT.

Real compassion is offering the daily basic care. What is basic care? Air, water, and food, given with love. Can this person breath on his/her own? Can this person digest and make urine on his/her own? If the answer is yes, sips of chicken broth, bites of pureed food, or even a feeding tube into the stomach are not extraordinary means of life support. Extraordinary means would be when basic care is administered with the help of machines, such as a respirator, dialysis, or parenteral feeding. When a patient is unable to draw a breath, unable to digest food, or unable to excrete the fluids given, these are conditions of end-stage organ failure. When the harm of offering treatment and nutrition is more than the benefit, it is morally correct to withdraw treatment.

Practically now, as long as the basic function of respiration, digestion, circulation, and excretion are present, even if slow, we ought to offer basic ordinary care: again - air, water, nutrition.

Even in a persistent vegetative state, where respiration, heartbeat, and urine-making are present, a feeding tube into the stomach <u>is not</u> an extraordinary, life-sustaining measure. The person in a vegetative state is not dead. We do not know why and for how long God will allow that state, but it is not for us to decide the time.

So what are we to do?

- Remember, life is sacred.
- God gave it and God will take it away.
- Do not judge anyone's "quality of life."
- Suffering is not wasted time. It is redemptive.
- Do not proactively facilitate the time of death.
- *Offer basic, ordinary measures of life sustenance.*
- Have an Advance Directive stating that ordinary lifesustaining measures are to be offered, but the most important part is to appoint a Durable Power of Attorney for Healthcare, choosing a trusted family member or friend with a similar value system.


