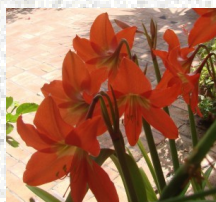

THE SCOPE OF RESURRECTION

When Jesus told His disciples about His impending resurrection from the dead, they did not know what He was talking about. But then, how could they? It had never been done before.

Most people and most religions long for eternal life in some form. It is natural for us to want to live forever, natural to want the good things in life to last, natural to view death as the greatest loss. But that hope was just that; a vague hope, a dull longing, an impossible dream...until Jesus actually did it. Now since rising from death has been done for the first time, it can be done by EVERYONE.

But not everyone knows that. The resurrection of Jesus is an accomplished fact, but your resurrection and mine are still only hopes, and vague hopes at that, since we cannot even imagine what coming back from the dead would be like. Therefore, even the resurrection of Jesus is problematic for most of us.

Some theologians think that we cannot really believe in Christ's resurrection until we believe in the possibility of our own resurrection. If we have no experience of rising from the dead in some form, then how can we believe in something we know absolutely nothing about?

If we have found no joy in sadness or hope in despair, how can we possibly find life in death? If we have not bounced back from failure, if we have not recuperated from suffering, then how could we reasonably expect to rise from our own death?

We innately yearn for eternal life, but that is no more than a wish until it has been verified by Christ. On the other hand, the resurrection of Jesus is just raw data until it is processed through our own experience.

But as great as this belief in personal resurrection is, as much as it should energize our everyday lives, it is still a selfish, self-centered view of life. Yes, the hope of living forever encourages us to live fully now; yes, the prospect of eternal happiness lightens our present sadness; and yes, we may grant that other people will also rise to eternity with God.

That is a wonderful prospect. But what is lacking in this attitude is a greater horizon of reality, our ingrained individualism makes us focus too intently on our own little space in the cosmos. We must remember that resurrection is the glorious fate of every atom of creation. In timeless eternity, every dust mote will sparkle with the glory of God.

Resurrection will happen to everything - not only humans are privileged to know that. Only we mere mortals know the immensity, the intensity of resurrection.

Only the true Christian understands that this little juggling act we call life is just a small act in the greatest show on earth.
