THE RISK OF CHANGE

Did you ever wonder why John the Baptist never became a follower of Jesus, at least as far as we know? Jesus boasted that John was the greatest person ever born, while John humbly said that he was not worthy to tie Jesus' shoelaces. Although John said that Jesus should baptize him, in fact Jesus let Himself be baptized by John, his inferior.

When John recognized the superiority of Jesus, he pointed it out to his disciples: "There is the Lamb of God!" But he himself did not go after Jesus. We know of only two of John's followers who snitched to Jesus. When John clearly recognized that Jesus was the man, why did he not fold up his ministry and move with his disciples into the Jesus camp?

After John baptized Jesus, and after Jesus went on a month long retreat, it is recorded that both of them had a separate group of followers and preached in different places. They even preached the same message: "Repent because the Kingdom is here." But their concept of the Kingdom, their different emphases, kept them apart - much the same as liberals and conservatives agree on the theory of church but fight over it's practice.

Jesus and John agreed that God would make God's presence felt in the near future. The idea of God becoming personally, immediately involved in world affairs at times was a common Jewish expectation. But the traditional understanding which was the view John held, was that God would come as Judge: God would punish evildoers, defeat Israel's enemies and make Jerusalem the center of God's reign.

Even in prison, John remained puzzled, and he apparently had not yet decided for Jesus. That is clear from the messengers he sent to Jesus if He really was God's anointed. John simply could not imagine God failing to punish evildoers, let alone God dining and drinking with blatant sinners. Jesus told John that His credentials were the biblical sign of healing and helping the poor. We are not told what John's response was. Imagine that a social justice group starts in your city. You go to their meetings, argue with them, agree on their commitment to Gospel values, but do not agree with their methods. You part ways. The groups goes on to help feed the poor and clothe the homeless, while you do nothing for the Kingdom.

John, sitting in his prison cell and hearing all about Jesus, was in a similar quandary. Firmly held convictions, ingrained values and life time experience are hard to uproot, even if they are wrong. Why take the risk of chance?

Saint John the Baptist, pray for us.


