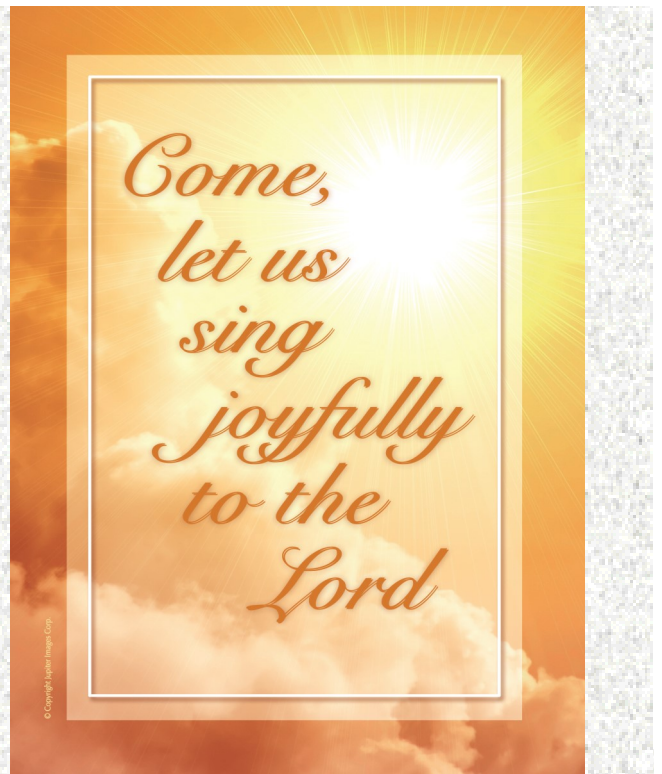

## Pictures of Suffering

The people were spellbound by His teaching. I bet they were even more spellbound by watching Jesus cast out the demon from that screaming, convulsing man. Because a picture is worth a thousand words.

A picture focuses on a specific moment in time and eternalizes it. Words fall silent at the image of the joy of a wedding celebration or the image of an ancient, wrinkled hand grasping the delicate finger of a newborn.

Suffering is especially immune to verbal description. Talk seems to mitigate the evil. Our modern minds are flooded with scenes of suffering. They have become so common place that they threaten to immunize us to the pain.

But in the last century, there have been several iconic pictures that shocked the world with images of horrendous suffering concentrated in one instant. One, by photographer Dorothea Lange, is called "Migrant Mother" and it pictures a distraught woman with two children hanging on her. Her hopeless stare betrays her understanding that she can not care for her children today or tomorrow or the next day, or maybe ever. But she will endure. This single picture symbolizes the plight of the homeless, the despair of the jobless, the pain of the hungry, the dashed dreams and forestalled hopes of everyone.

Another image, by photographer Nick Ut, shows a small child in Vietnam running toward the camera, naked, arms spread as if imploring help. The child is burning, her skin covered with napalm. This screaming human being epitomizes the fragility of life.

These two pictures are worth an infinite number of words, but they need words to describe how we see them. We first confess that pictures separate us from the subjects; suffering is happening to them, while we are only watching it happen. But communication can lead to communion, so we are allowed to participate in their suffering to a minimal degree.

Still we have seen so much suffering that we are numbed, rendered helpless by the enormity of human misery. Some call it "confession fatigue". Yet I have seen more clothes, food, and money than all the naked, hungry, poor children could ever need.

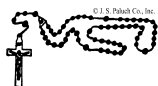
The Christian conclusion must always be: "There is not their suffering and my suffering— there is only our suffering.

This weekend's readings remind us that even in our greatest affliction, we should maintain confidence in God, who heals us. The Responsorial Psalm, "*If Today You Hear God's Voice*" (#66) states that we should not be afraid to put our trust in God. This ties into today's Gospel, where Jesus cast demons out of the man in Capernaum.

A hymn that speaks of Jesus driving out unclean spirits has been hard to find. In the new hymnal, "*Praise The One Who Breaks The Darkness*" reflects a great deal of what Mark is writing in his Gospel. The good news is that it is to a familiar tune, the "*Nettleton*" tune that we know from "*God, We Praise You*", "*Sing A New Church*", and other hymns.

Following with the theme that our trust that God will take us through even the worst, unclean spirit, "*We Are The Light Of The World*" (#592) and "*Blest Are They*" (#759) that states the Beatitudes, we remember that we can move past our earthly afflictions and rejoice in God. "*You Are Mine*" (#721) reminds us that even when we are afraid, God is with us.
