

With Our Whole Hearts

Saint Paul bemoaned the fact that he was not free, but we are free, and that freedom is the power to achieve our desires, express our personality, and define our very self by the things we choose.

Even the selfish singer knows that when he roars, "I gotta be me!" he is expressing the true nature of freedom. He does not want to be free to do anything in particular; he wants to do only what **he** wants to do, not somebody else. By doing those things, he becomes what he chooses. In the end, freedom is the power to define our self, to create our self, to be what we want to be. Of course, some choices are more important than others. We add a different dimension to our self depending on whether the choice is dessert, car, or spouse. Let's take one of those for an example.

Of several hundred models, you choose a BMW convertible. That was not a whim; you did it on purpose and you did it with all your past experience brought to bear - your experience of speed and wind and thrill and image - along with your wish for the future. You wanted people to be impressed by the convertible and envious of the BMW.

Every single act of freedom in any direction helps form our personality. Day by day, choice by choice, we slowly fill out the contours of our self from every perspective. This song confirms our musical taste, that lie deepens our dishonesty level, that kind act increases our love quotient, and these decisions are strongly influenced by our entire past history, which means that every decision sets us up for the next free choice. Each of us is in an ongoing adventure, continuously creating ourselves anew.

Our freedom is limited by the number of people available to us, by the number of people to whom we are acceptable, by the unfathomable uniqueness of every person and by the great difficulty in bringing our total self to any particular decision. Thus, even in this most important, most personal act of freedom, we are still incapable of committing our total self to the absolute object of our greatest desire.

But what if there were someone who was able to embrace all of our difficult desires in one, and also attractive enough to engage our total freedom of choice? Then both factors of freedom would be in place, and we could finally define our self

That someone is God of course - the source and goal of our freedom.

We **must** finally create our true self in the face of God. Some great saints do it early in life. Their fundamental choice of God becomes so overwhelming that other choices become insignificant. They can live in a cave or become a king or be killed.

You and I also choose God, but only as one of many other choices, which is why our personalities waffle so much. But one day we will choose God with our whole heart and mind and soul.
