# Pastor's Corner

# FOLLOWING THROUGH

Baptism marks the beginning of the believer's life in Christ. Although the sacramental

initiative is an auspicious one, it is nevertheless only a beginning. In order for the seeds of grace that are sown in Baptism to grow to full flower and to bear the good fruit of an authentic faith life, believers must follow through from the moment of their Baptism to the end of their days. Following through means living a graced life rooted in a relationship with God, one that inspires and influences every other relationship and life experience.

For those who are graced with the sacrament of Baptism as infants, the responsibility for following through first rests upon parental shoulders. Until such time as baptismal promises are understood and owned by the growing believers, the adults in the child's life are the spiritual mentors. But if these adults do not follow through for the child, then the sacrament remains sterile, its graces untapped.

Those who come to Baptism as adults accept the responsibility to follow through for themselves. To foster the efforts of believers in the lifelong process of following through, the scripture selections of this weekend offer the example of the Isaiah servant. Called by God and commissioned for service, the Servant experienced what could be understood as a baptismal consecration and initiation. The Servant, chosen and uniquely graced for a ministry of justice, healing, and liberation, still had to claim God's grace, to appropriate it and follow through the promptings of grace until his "baptismal" profession had been realized in his words and in his works.

In this weekend's second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter is featured in a watershed moment in the growth and development of the early Church. At his own Baptism, Peter understood that he was being claimed by Christ just as Peter himself declared his allegiance to Jesus. At Cornelius' home, through the illuminating power of the Holy Spirit he had received at his Baptism, Peter understood that his belonging to Christ required his all-inclusive embrace of the entire body of Christ in all its members. Peter had begun to understand the impartiality of God, and as a baptized believer, he was challenged to be open and welcoming to all others in Christ.

In our gospel from St. Mark, believers are reassured of the support of God's grace in living out the promises that were made and the commitment that was begun at Baptism. To illustrate this truth, St. Mark offers us a literary and theological window into the Baptism of Jesus. Like Jesus, we have been baptized with water, and like Jesus, we have received the Holy Spirit through our baptismal anointing. We for our part, are to heed the voice that spoke from the heavens on that day and to recognize Jesus as the beloved Son of God whom we are to emulate in all we are, in all we do.

This same Jesus will support our efforts in making our own his mission of justice, healing, and liberation. This same beloved Son, who is Brother to all, will enable us to see beyond race, gender, nationality, and all other possible human limitations, so as to welcome others without exception in to the community of Jesus.

This very Jesus, who submitted to baptism in order to be immersed in the human condition, will guide our growth and inspire our efforts as long as we continue to follow his lead. In our faithful following, we will be able to avail ourselves of the daily graces that God gives to all who are trying to follow through in keeping the promises and realizing the commitment of their baptism.
