

Last March 2015, for four days, our third, fourth, fifth, sixth, and seventh graders, underwent the TERRA NOVA testing conducted by McGraw-Hill Company who annually conducts the test nationwide.

The students were tested in the areas of Reading, Language, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
