LENT: OUR SPEED BUMP

Journeys can be wonderful adventures, but they can also be dangerous. They have a way of taking unexpected turns or offering surprising endings. Many journeys are a normal, even mundane, part of life; same carpool ride, bus route to work, business flight. But some take us to a new place; a vacation, a different school or career, a detour.

We learn about two journeys in our readings from Isaiah and St. Mark this weekend. Abraham and Isaac set out for a high place, and Peter, James, and John are led by Jesus to a mountain. Both journeys offer a new revelation about God...both required faithfulness.

Every year, we face the same Lenten journey, walk the same way of the cross, and listen to the same readings. We participate in the same rites with catechumens and candidates. When we begin the season with ashes, we fully plan to make *this* the Lent where we pay attention to the conversion to which the church and the Gospel call us. We don't mean for time to slip away - yet days fly by. We have the best intentions - and still we may arrive at Easter without the transformation we intended to have.

Perhaps we need a few speed bumps on our path to shake us from our complacency and waken us to the inner journey of Lent. We need to be jarred from everyday experiences. Do we face our journey with the same radical faith that Abraham carried up the heights, prepared to offer what we hold most precious to show our deep trust in God's mercy and grace?

Yes, God needs to bump our heads on the roof of our cars a bit so we might open our eyes and see that we are not walking alone on *our* path but rather are on *God's* path.

What will make us pay attention? What speed bump will help us hear God's words about Jesus that were spoken to the disciples, "*Listen to Him?*" Like Peter, we have our own plans. We know where we want to pitch our tents and circle our wagons.

When it comes to changing our hearts, we each have a journey to make, one that includes soul-searching and personal examination. On Ash Wednesday, we heard Jesus' words giving us three good markers for how to reform our lives during this season: give alms, pray, and fast.

We are all people in need of reconciliation and reform. As individuals and families, parish communities, and neighborhoods, we must ask what speed bumps we prefer to avoid. What would we prefer to drive *around* rather than face being jarred into action?

We at times get complacent. We use distractions to buffer us. But once again, we have the Lenten season to begin a new journey, to awaken us to what we ignore and neglect. Our Lenten journey can be dangerous. It can surprise us. We know it led Jesus to Calvary and the cross, but the journey can lead us to reform our lives and return our hearts to God *or* at least jar them with a speed bump or two.

LENTEN PRACTICES

The Bishops of the U.S. prescribe, as minimal obligations, that all persons **14 years and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.** All persons 18 years and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to **fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday while the other two meals on those days are to be light.**

All the faithful are encouraged to attend Mass, to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to use the Sacrament of Penance, and to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, to become involved in Community of Disciples and to attend Stations of the Cross.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be celebrated during Lent on **Fridays (except on March 27th due to The Passion Play) at 2:00pm and 7:00pm.** Stations will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

OPERATION RICE BOWL: Participation in Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl unites us in prayer, fasting, and giving with millions of people throughout the world who are oppressed by poverty, injustice, war, disease, lack of education and other opportunities. **Packets are on the window sills of church at the first and fourteenth Stations of the Cross.**

Our Lenten music selections reflect the major themes of the season of Lent: prayer, fasting, mercy, and making whole our lives. As Jesus is tempted in the desert and refuses to give in, so must we avoid temptation. As Jesus is transfigured before his apostles, so must we move ourselves closer to the image of God that we get to know through Jesus.

"From Ashes to the Living Font" (#474) utilizes the melody from "Lord, Who Throughout These 40 Days", giving us the flexibility to sing a verse that matches the day's Gospel reading. "Change Our Hearts" (#493) is a powerful reminder that we must use these 40 days of repentance to make sure that we have our hearts in the right direction. "Merciful God" (#489) is a reminder that our salvation comes from God alone. The refrain has three options: one specifically for Ash Wednesday, one for gathering, and one for communion.

Our Mass setting this Lenten season is Mass of Joy and Peace, found in the hymnal #209, #211, #212, #215, and #216.
