MESSENGERS

Are you old enough to recall the days when a messenger at the door with a telegram was enough to make hearts beat faster and anxiety mount? Telegrams and the messengers who delivered them often signaled bad or sad news that could not wait for postal delivery. In times of war, messengers bearing telegrams were particularly dreaded.

In today's world of instant messaging, both good and bad news can be communicated via the internet. As a result, the messenger has become invisible, has faded into obsolescence behind the technology that has facilitated our access to one another.

But in the past, messages were delivered in person. Human envoys either committed the messages to memory or carried a sealed missive from the sender, which they were to guard with their very lives until they could deliver it to the recipient. At times, when an unwelcome message was delivered to a particularly combative recipient, the messenger met with violence. Some messengers even suffered death for their efforts, hence the phrase "kill the messenger."

Something of the challenge and dangers to which many messengers are exposed is reflected in this weekend's scripture selections. In the critique of salvation history offered in our first reading from the Book of Chronicles, the reading cites the many messengers God sent to the Israelites only to have them mistreated and the messages rejected. As a result, the kingdoms of Israel and Judah were plundered. Wave after wave of oppressors came, and each in turn was conquered by the next until Cyrus. The King of Persia, who the prophets believed to be God's instrument, sent forth another message that held out great hope for the rebirth of the Israelites and the reestablishment of their way of life and worship.

While the renewal that came about due to the efforts of Cyrus was truly life-giving, there would come from the Israelites and for all the peoples of the earth another messenger with a uniquely important message. Jesus, who was sent into the world by a living God, would prove Himself to be the message and messenger par excellence. In Him, God has spoken to a sinful world, not about condemnation but about believing. Faith in the message Jesus came to speak, faith in the person of the messenger - this faith will be the door through which to enter into eternal life. Jesus was sent to deliver a message of light in a darkened world. Those who believe in Him live in the truth that does not fear or hide from the light.

In the years between Jesus' resurrection and our own, some have carried messages intended to keep the Gospel and its challenges pertinent and provocative in a world whose focus is often pulled in other directions. Other messengers will speak with an authority that is born of their concern for and commitment to others.

Not all the messages that are spoken into our lives will be welcome. Decidedly negative messages will be spoken by detractors and critics of the Church. Still other messages may point to the discrepancies between the message we preach and the manner in which we translate that message into our lives. Always remember Jesus encourages us to listen carefully and conscientiously to whomever God sends our way.

LENTEN PRACTICES

The Bishops of the U.S. prescribe, as minimal obligations, that all persons 14 years and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. All persons 18 years and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged to attend Mass, to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to use the Sacrament of Penance, and to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, to become involved in Community of Disciples and to attend Stations of the Cross.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be celebrated during Lent on Fridays (except on March 27th due to The Passion Play) at 2:00pm and 7:00pm. Stations will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

Our Lenten music selections reflect the major themes of the season of Lent: prayer, fasting, mercy, and making whole our lives. As Jesus is tempted in the desert and refuses to give in, so must we avoid temptation. As Jesus is transfigured before his apostles, so must we move ourselves closer to the image of God that we get to know through Jesus.

"From Ashes to the Living Font" (#474) utilizes the melody from "Lord, Who Throughout These 40 Days", giving us the flexibility to sing a verse that matches the day's Gospel reading. "Change Our Hearts" (#493) is a powerful reminder that we must use these 40 days of repentance to make sure that we have our hearts in the right direction. "Merciful God" (#489) is a reminder that our salvation comes from God alone. The refrain has three options: one specifically for Ash Wednesday, one for gathering, and one for communion.

Our Mass setting this Lenten season is Mass of Joy and Peace, found in the hymnal #209, #211, #212, #215, and #216.
