WORTH WAITING FOR

Advent is a time for waiting. We are waiting for the twofold coming of Christ: at Christmas and at the end of the world. That is one reason why Christianity is a religion of waiting, of hope, of expectation. No matter what wonderful things God has done in the past, we expect even more wonderful things in the future.

This religious attitude fits well with our national character. Americans are, above all, a hopeful, future-oriented people. A survey showed that 80% of us are waiting for some significant thing to happen; getting married, having a baby, finding a job, retiring. At every stage of life, we find something to look forward to.

One might think that since we seem to live in expectation, we ought to be experts at waiting. But anyone who thinks that, has never waited in a grocery line, waited for a bus or train, waited for a light to change or for the mail to come. We have to wait, and the frustration with the present time, the eagerness to be somewhere else, often makes us edgy and unpleasant.

But we have to wait, so we might as well get used to it. We might wait more peacefully if we understand what we were doing and tried to do it better.

First, we must come to terms with the fact of time. Although there is no such thing as time—there are no calendars in the sky, no clocks in space—grain grows at a certain rate, fruit ripens at a certain speed, people mature in a temporal process. Absolutely everything is governed by time, but only humans wait. In exactly the same ten minutes that puppies play and trees grow, humans anxiously wait. That is because puppies and trees naturally know how to live in the present. They are perfectly content to be doing whatever they are doing at any moment. We humans have to accept that everything happens at precisely the right time. The right time for it - even if not always the right time for us.

While we are waiting for anything, pray about something; your wayward child or aged parent, starving children, people without jobs. There are seven billion people to pray for, and there are millions of things going on that could use your prayer: the economy and world peace.

With prayer, you get closer to God and help these people and situations. You expand your own heart to billions of people and events. Instead of focusing your attention on fretful waiting, you join all of humanity and all of creation in this simple instant and bring them all to God's attention.

Now isn't that worth waiting for?
