I WANT TO SEE

Until his death at age 76 in 1999, Basil Hume was the Cardinal Archbishop of Westminster and a monk of Ampleforth Abbey in Great Britain. Hume was fond of traveling to Lourdes in France and particularly enjoyed the zigzag path that leads to the grotto. What you first see on the path, said Hume, is a statue of the blind Bartimaeus. Why is he there? Although he looks over the grotto, he sees nothing; he is blind. Hume learned that the statue had been placed there by an Italian woman who had gone to Lourdes seeking to be cured of her blindness. Although she left Lourdes still unable to see, she had rediscovered her faith and realized that her newfound spiritual acuity was more to be prized than any physical sight.

Many of you are blessed with the ability to see both physically and spiritually. Physically, we can take in and appreciate the ordinary as well as exotic beauties of the created universe. Our spiritual sight leads us to look beyond these beauties to believe in the One who has brought everyday and everyone into being. Seeing and believing - one action leads to the other and together both lead to God.


So it was for Bartimaeus. In response to his "I want to see," Jesus relieved him of his blindness. Once he was able to see, Bartimaeus followed Jesus on the way. Seeing and believing marked his path to discipleship. We rejoice with Bartimaeus and are grateful to share his experience. We can similarly appreciate the sentiments of the Italian women at Lourdes, who was content to be able to see with the eyes of faith. However, we might find a little hint of regret forming in our hearts. Who among us does not want to see God? To see and be seen by Jesus? Who has not wanted to cry out to God, "I want to see! I want to actually behold with my eyes the wondrous face of God!"

Cardinal Hume shared the same request. He also shared how he personally learned to resolve that regret with deeper believing. Years ago, Hume had a friend who had been born blind. Despite his physical challenge, the man was a passionate fan of cricket and attended matches regularly. Hume used to sit beside his friend and give a running commentary of the plays and the players. His friend hung on his every word with rapt attention and great excitement. Because of Hume's words, the blind friend was, in a very real sense, able to "see" and enjoy his favorite pastime.

That experience taught the Cardinal something about faith. We do not see Jesus present in the Eucharist, nor did we see Him rise from the dead. We do not touch God with our hands or hear God's voice with our ears. So, in a certain sense, we are all blind, like the friends at the cricket match. We are all blind Bartimaeuses who cry out, "I want to see!"

In response to this insistent, prayerful request, God directs our eyes and ears, our hearts and minds, to the sacred word. There are those who want to see and touch and hear God who will find a running commentary offered by inspired witnesses. Their fidelity to the message entrusted to them encourages our own faith. Their attentiveness to God's word sharpens our own acuity; their passion for the challenge of the word reaches out and grasps us. If we allow them, the word and the messengers will enable us to see God.

ST. IGNATIUS PARISH APPEAL 2015-2016

Recently, you should have received a letter regarding our parish appeal. While we were a little late getting started with last year's appeal, we are running this year's appeal on time. The 2015-2016 annual parish appeal began on October 11, 2015 and will run until January 31, 2016. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is needed for the daily operation of our parish. This year, our parish appeal goal is \$175,000. These funds will be used to offset our operational costs such as utilities, insurances, building maintenance, grounds upkeep, as well as many other operational obligations. In addition, these funds will help with future infrastructure upgrades, such as building maintenance on the Church, the pointing on the school, and the completion of the upgrades to the school entrance. I ask that you do your best with what you have for this critical fundraiser. I know, as in the past, I can count on your financial assistance. ST. IGNATIUS BEGINS RECYCLING

On October 5, 2015, St. Ignatius implemented a recycle program for all buildings. This new recycle program is mandated plus it reduces our monthly trash removal cost. There will be signs and specific recycle trash containers located in all buildings for all recyclable items to be placed in.

Please know that our trash dumpsters outside are also being replaced with specific dumpsters for this new recycle program. One dumpster is designated for trash only and the other dumpster is designated for recyclables.

Here are some facts when it comes to why recycling is important as a community:

- Average person contributes **4 lbs. of trash per day.**
- Average American uses 7 trees a year in paper, wood and other products made from trees.
- We cut down 2,000,000,000 trees a year - 2 billion.
- United States is the #1 trash producing country in the world. **One person living in the U.S. produces 1,600 lbs. in one year.**
- Amount of plastic bottles thrown away each year would circle the earth 4 times. The circumference of the Earth is 24,901 miles. **That is 99,604 miles of plastic bottles.**
- **Plastic Bottle Facts** - 250,000 plastic bottles are dumped every hour; 6 million plastic bottles a day; 4,167 plastic bottles dumped per minute; 69.5 plastic bottles dumped per second.

In today's Gospel, we hear the story of the blind man who gains his sight. There are many implications here beyond this miracle. "Gather Us In" (#848) reminds us that, to be completed, we must gather with the blind and the lame. In the Gospel, the blind man is left behind, begging on the side of the road. "We Are Called" (#807) reminds us we are to love tenderly with justice those who are especially cast aside. "Open My Eyes" (#651) is a reminder that we need the Lord's help to see, not just physically, but to help see the Lord's face - the truths of our faith. "Taste and See" (#930) reminds us that we must use all of our senses to praise God. "I sought the Lord, who answered me, "just as the blind man. The blind man wanted some simple pity and he got much more. As the Psalmist sings this week, "The Lord has done great things for us. We are filled with joy!"
