GOD OVERCOMES VIOLENCE

When we were kids, we used to play cowboys and Indians. We would tear the branch off a sumac tree and turn it into a horse. Then we would take turns being Indians, who were killed by cowboys. And when we got bored with that, we would turn the branch into a rifle and pretend to kill Germans or Japanese soldiers.

It seemed like innocent fun at the time. We had never seen an Indian, never knew how they were decimated by pioneers. We had never seen a German or Japanese person - they were just foreign ideas to us. We had no experience of war, knew nothing about death except for seeing an occasional lifeless bird or squirrel. And most importantly for our consciences, the dead never stayed dead. They had to get up and go home for supper.

But as we grow older, we have sons and brothers killed in war and read about citizens being murdered in their beds and cities bombed into oblivion and whole populations wiped out.

Perhaps we have lost faith in peace talks, we no longer honor treaties, we think that negotiation is just a desperate maneuver for stalling. We have accepted the human reality that the road to peace is never-ending, that peace is just another word for the temporary cessation of bloodshed.

The ancient Romans knew it before we did. They had a saying: "Men are wolves to other men." Except the wolves do not usually prey on each other, as humans do.

Most of us have not killed anyone. But just as there are degrees of guilt in murder, so there are lesser degrees of violence against others. All of us have hated, envied, and disparaged others. We have diminished their humanity. We have violated their person.

Whence comes this perversion of human society, this presumed right to resolve differences with violence, this disregard for life? Part of it is fear, the fear that they will get us before we get them. Science has discovered the source of fear. It is an almond-shaped knot of nerves at the base of the brain cells.

That would be true if violence were biological. But it is not - it is spiritual. Violence is the egotistical belief that nothing and no one should stand in the way of our immediate wishes.

We have lost respect for others. We have turned companions into competitors, friends into enemies, subjects into objects, persons into things. We have finally learned to treat others as we treat ourselves - as objects of disdain.

In the helpless, powerless child, the disciples were to find the simplicity that would enable them to see beyond their selfish ambitions and understand the meaning of life in which Jesus was calling them. Don't forget you and I are His disciples today!

Friday, September 25 - New York City; 11:30 AM - Interreligious Prayer Service; National September 11 Memorial and Museum.

Friday, September 25 - New York City; 6:00 PM - Mass for the Preservation of Peace and Justice; Madison Square Garden.

Saturday, September 26 - Philadelphia; 10:30 AM - Votive Mass of our Lady, Mother of the Church; Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul.

Sunday, September 27 - Philadelphia; 4:00 PM - Concluding Mass of the World Meeting of Families; Benjamin Franklin Parkway.

I am writing to ask for your prayers. In April, I damaged my shoulder but since I had no pain, just weakness, I did not think much of it....just another injury that time will heal. On Monday, August 24th, I finally made an appointment with a shoulder specialist. I have no pain, but still have the weakness. After x-rays and an MRI, it was discovered that I tore my shoulder tendon and that to heal properly, I will require surgery, six weeks in a sling, and nine months of physical therapy. The surgery has been scheduled for Thursday, October 1st. Because of this, I will be away from the Parish from September 28th until October 21st.
