On **Sunday, October 11th**, our Parish will begin its Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion after the 11:30 Mass. Evening prayer will conclude our day on Sunday at 7:30 PM, Monday at 7:30 PM and Tuesday at 7:30 PM. Our solemn closing of the Forty Hours on Tuesday evening will include a candlelight procession outside the church.

Father Matthew Guckin, Staff Member of the Archdiocesan Office for Catholic Education, will be the homilist.

Father's theme for the 40 hours will be "The Eucharist - God's Passion for Us, God's Mercy Toward Us."

As part of our Forty Hours, on **Monday, October 12th at 1:15PM** in the church, our parish will be conducting a special celebration of the **SACRAMENT OF ANOINTING OF THE SICK** for people (regardless of age) who suffer from any chronic or acute physical, emotional or medical problems. 
All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00am Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.



You may have noticed that the World Meeting of Families prayer card in your pews has something new on the reverse side of it. *"Sound the Bell of Holy Freedom"* was chosen as the official hymn for the World Meeting of Families. Parishes across the diocese are singing the hymn as we lead up to the World Meeting of Families at the end of the month.

The text of the hymn was written by Norbertine Priest Andrew Ciferni, a South Philadelphia native who formerly worked at Archmere Academy in Delaware. The music was composed by Normand Gouin, a former director of music at Old St. Joseph's Church in Philadelphia. After Labor Day weekend, we will sing the hymn at the opening and close of the Mass, verses 1-3 at the start, and verses 4-6 at the end of Mass, as the whole Archdiocese unites in one voice to "Sound the Bell of Holy Freedom".

"Although we may feel unsure how best to comfort those who mourn, we must stand with them in their time of suffering. Miscarriage touches the lives of many people, yet all too often this tragedy remains unaddressed. This lack of response not only leads to unresolved grief, but also fails to clearly manifest our belief that each person, from conception onward, is precious and unique." (USCCB Respect Life Program).

One in six pregnancies are lost in miscarriages in this country. That is a lot of babies that are in Heaven waiting for their parents. We need to pray for those children and TO them. Beyond the 'natural' loss as determined by God's plan for whatever reason (usually for the good of the parents in some way), we have our cultural 'loss' - legalized abortion...over 56 million surgical abortions since 1973 and even more (hundreds of millions) as a result of abortifacient pills and IUDs. ALL of these children were intended by God to be part of HIS plan. It matters not what OUR plan is or was...this is the surrender; this is the love; this is the sacrifice that He asks we give Him as He gave us with His crucifixion and death on the Cross. What we all may NOT realize is that these children will be resurrected again to exist for all eternity in the finality of His plan...whether we are there or not...free will.
