

## THE SHEPHERD'S FLOCK

In Christian art, the earliest depictions of Jesus Christ were not of his crucifixion or of his resurrection. The first known renderings of Jesus show him as the Good Shepherd, the image put before us in today's readings. In the Gospel passage Jesus reveals that he is the shepherd and his followers are his "flock."

In the first and second readings, we are told more about the flock. The passage from Acts assures us that both Jews and Gentiles are called to follow Jesus. It is faith, not birthright, that makes us part of the company of believers. In the passage from the book of Revelation we learn that the flock that follows this Lamb of God will also be washed in his blood. They will endure a time of trial before they enjoy eternal life. Be assured of the promise, we are told, but know there is a price to be paid.

## From the Administrator's Desk...

HOW TO PRAY,  
when "I just don't know how to say more...." Or, "Does God even hear me?" Or, fill in the blank \_\_\_\_\_!

As I write, the refrain of today's Responsorial Psalm (Tuesday in the Third Week of Easter) comes to mind. What a perfect model of prayer it provides:

"Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit."

These final words of our Savior on the Cross follow on the Acts of the Apostles' account of the dying words of our First Martyr, The Deacon St. Stephen: "Lord, Jesus, receive my spirit. Lord, do not hold this sin against them." Can you think of a better night prayer? In fact, the Church's official Night Prayer includes it every night of the week; and it works at any time, in any place. Say it as your morning prayer, confident that the Lord will be with you every moment of this day, guiding, directing, correcting, inspiring, sending the Spirit to make every action pleasing to the Father and of service to your neighbor.

Or, consider the refrain of today's Responsorial that we hear 5 times and sing 4:

"We are His people, the sheep of His flock"

Keep it in mind. Say it whenever you're tempted to be overwhelmed by the spouse, the kids, the in-laws, the neighbors, the job. It's a reminder that we are not in charge. The Good Shepherd is—the Shepherd who gets us through the thicket of every challenge. Nine times out of ten, this inspired phrase will inspire you. It makes for perfect prayer.

Another hint: You don't know what to say in prayer? Good! Because prayer, in the first place, does not consist in what we say, but in what we *hear*. More about that another time.
