

PARISH CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THE SUMMER

Happy New Year! Yes you read that correctly, July 1st 2016 is the first day of Fiscal Year 2017. As we enter this new budget year, there are several changes being made by the Archdiocese in the way we account for our income and expenses. The biggest change is the separation in accounting for the church and the school. They will now be kept as separate entities both in our checking accounts and our accounting software. This will allow us to keep a better record of income and expenses and give us a clearer picture of the costs to running the church and the school. This year the parish is projected to subsidize the school in the amount of \$326,495, or 24.52% of their operating budget. We can provide this subsidy to our parish school only through your generosity to our Sunday collections, Annual Appeal, and Christmas and Easter collections. We thank you for your continued and faithful support of our parish and our school.
