## HOPE AND FORGIVENESS

There were some interesting conceptions of sin prevalent in the time of the Hebrew scriptures.

There was the belief that God punished sin immediately. Those who suffered disease or misfortune were, therefore, sinners getting their due from the Almighty.

Today's first reading hints at another kind of God. When David admits his sin, Nathan declares, "The LORD on his part has forgiven your sin" (2 Samuel 12:13b). Here was not a vengeful God but a merciful God. What good news that must have been to David and those who, like him, could be honest enough to admit their sinfulness!

Jesus is the good news of God's mercy and forgiveness incarnate. Without Jesus, perhaps the good news would have been too good to believe, too difficult to imagine. But there he is in today's Gospel, the God-man, forgiving a sinner and declaring that she is forgiven because of her great love. There is hope, then, for the rest of us sinners, if only we love enough!

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time  
The Chicken or the Egg?



Remember when it was easy to tell the good guys from the bad guys? The Pharisee in today's Gospel thought he knew who was bad and who was good. He looked at the woman who came to see Jesus and saw a sinner. Jesus saw a loving person who needed forgiveness. Her love for Jesus brought her to forgiveness: "Her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little" (Luke 7:47). But when Jesus explains this in a parable, he seems to be saying that forgiveness is the cause of love. So which came first, love or forgiveness?


Like the question about the chicken or the egg, the answer is both: forgiveness leads to love for God, but God's love is the source of all forgiveness. So the woman in the Gospel loved Jesus because she trusted in God's forgiveness. Jesus responded to that love by forgiving her sins.

Notice how Jesus compares the woman and the Pharisee. By pointing out how little the Pharisee did to welcome Jesus, he reminds the man that he is a sinner, too. But the man doesn't recognize his own sins and so does not ask for forgiveness. That's why the woman experiences Jesus' love, while the Pharisee does not. Luke emphasizes this with the mention of other women whom Jesus had cured or from whom he had cast out demons. They would have been seen by the Pharisee as sinners, since the Jews believed that illness was punishment for sin. Yet they are the ones who support Jesus in his journeys.

Like the chicken or the egg, we might come to see God's love on a retreat or at a parish mission. Touched by that love, we seek forgiveness. On the other hand, we may feel that God is far from us because of our sins, but when we finally get the courage to confess them, we are filled with the joy of freedom from our sins. We have the opportunity to experience Jesus' love when we ask for his forgiveness. Or we can pretend to be without sin and miss out on that love. God loves all sinners, but only the ones who admit it are able to experience that love.
