From the Desk of Father Jon...**REFLECTION FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT**

The Gospel that we hear this Sunday is the Johannine account of the woman caught in the act of adultery brought before Jesus by the scribes and the Pharisees. This account is interesting because it is not found in the earliest written Gospel of John scrolls, it is believed to come from the oral tradition of the Gospel. This pericope is often commented on by the Fathers of the Church like Saint Augustine and Saint Bede the Venerable and gives us much to reflect upon.

Prior to the woman being brought before Jesus, we hear that Jesus was meditating on the Mount of Olives in the evening and then arrived early at the Temple to teach those that were present. The importance of Jesus in prayer on this mount is that olives and oil were not only employed for food but also as a salve to sooth wearied limbs. This is a harbinger as to the action that will soon occur.

In reading this account, we come to the realization that the scribes and Pharisees were watching the activities of this poor woman in order to trap her. In this rush to ensnare Jesus, they used this woman as a mere means to an end. In their actions, they stripped away her humanity. Adultery was an offense that was punishable by death in our Lord's time. It had an impact on the family and societal stability, and because of that, it was considered both a religious and a civil offense.

Throwing her in front of Jesus, they believed that they had finally found a two-fold trap (religious and civil) that Jesus could not escape. They gave her to the just Judge and in Jesus she finds a forgiving Savior.

This is where we witness an incredible event. Jesus bends down and writes on the ground. The Greek term used literally means writing an account of what is owed. Those who bring the woman before Jesus now have to face what they are accountable for before God. When confronted with the reality of their sinfulness, they drop their stones and walk away.

Jesus then offers the woman a pardon for her sins and gives her back her freedom and humanity.

This Gospel is a reminder that we can never look on and judge another. True society is not built on scapegoating, but on compassion and forgiveness.

"God our Father, we find it difficult to come to You, because our knowledge of You is imperfect. In our ignorance we have imagined You to be our enemy; we have wrongly thought that You take pleasure in punishing our sins; and we have foolishly conceived You to be a tyrant over human life. But since Jesus came among us, He has shown that You are loving, that You are on our side against all that stunts life, and that our resentment against You was groundless. So we come to You, asking You to forgive our past ignorance, and Your forgiving love, through Jesus Christ our Lord." (Prayer of Saint Augustine)

LENTEN PRACTICES

The Bishops of the U.S. prescribe, as minimal obligations, that all persons **14 years and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent.** All persons 18 years and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to **fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday while the other two meals on those days are to be light.**

All the faithful are encouraged to attend Mass, to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to use the Sacrament of Penance, and to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, to become involved in Community of Disciples and to attend Stations of the Cross.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS will be celebrated during Lent on **Fridays (except on March 18th due to The Passion Play) at 2:30pm and 7:00pm.** Stations will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.

OPERATION RICE BOWL: Participation in Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl unites us in prayer, fasting, and giving with millions of people throughout the world who are oppressed by poverty, injustice, war, disease, lack of education and other opportunities. **Packets are on the window sills of church at the first and fourteenth Stations of the Cross.**

H.O.P.E. is a group of concerned parishioners who are willing to help anyone in the geographical boundaries of our parish.



As you may or may not know, our parish is currently contemplating a major capital campaign to raise the funds needed to retire parish debt, renovate the church, and establish a parish reserve fund. In fact, we are now in the process of conducting a *Fundraising Feasibility & Planning Study* to assess how much we can feasibly expect to raise and to get member feedback and suggestions about our proposed project and plans. This process has already involved conducting a number of personal, confidential interviews with select members.



Now, we are inviting all of our member households to participate in this study by going to the following online webpage to read about the proposed project and complete a brief, online survey questionnaire. Individual responses on these survey forms are encouraged but we also ask that only one survey per household be completed. All survey responses will be strictly confidential and will only be seen and tabulated by *Walsh & Associates, Church Fundraising Specialists* - the firm we hired to conduct the study for us. Our Lenten music selections reflect the major themes of the season of Lent: prayer, fasting, mercy, and making whole our lives. As Jesus is tempted in the desert and refuses to give in, so must we avoid temptation. As Jesus is transfigured before his apostles, so must we move ourselves closer to the image of God that we get to know through Jesus.

"From Ashes to the Living Font" (#474) utilizes the melody from "Lord, Who Throughout These 40 Days," giving us the flexibility to sing a verse that matches the day's Gospel reading. "Change Our Hearts" (#493) is a powerful reminder that we must use these 40 days of repentance to make sure that we have our hearts in the right direction. "Merciful God" (#489) is a reminder that our salvation comes from God alone. The refrain has three options: one specifically for Ash Wednesday, one for gathering, and one for communion.

Our Mass setting this Lenten season is Mass of Joy and Peace, found in the hymnal #209, #211, #212, #215, and #216.
