

THE GIFT OF PEACE

We are offered another vision in today's second reading, a vision of the New Jerusalem, "coming down out of heaven from God" (Revelation 21:10). Read between the lines describing the radiant city, and we find that the greatest beauty revealed is the beauty of perfect symmetry and order, a city founded on the faith of the twelve tribes of Israel and the Twelve Apostles, lit only by the glory of God. The first reading and the Gospel are linked to this idealized description of the New Jerusalem. In both we read of distress and disturbance countered by the gift of peace. "My peace I give to you," Jesus assures his disciples at the Last Supper (John 14:27). In keeping with that gift, the apostles and elders, in the reading from Acts, decide not to disturb the peace of new Gentile believers. The undue burden of circumcision will not be imposed on them.

From the Administrator's Desk...


There are many kinds of prayer. You may have learned the same acronym as I early in our parish school days: A C T S:

A = Prayer of ADORATION
C = Prayer of CONTRITION
T = Prayer of THANKSGIVING
S = Prayer of SUPPLICATION

We needn't bother with the seminary one: LEIS, which has nothing to do with what Hawaiians place on visitors shoulders. No, it stands for: Latreutical, Eucharistic, Impetratory, Supplicator.

Children start with the *S* word: *supplication*—self-centered critters as they can be. At nine years old, I heard that God would give us whatever we want, if we “made” the nine First Fridays. I made them, but didn’t get the bike I was praying for. So, I did them a second time, but the First Friday of April, in around 1947, was Good Friday; and in those days there was no distribution of Holy Communion on Good Friday. So, the sequence was broken! How unfair can you get? I gave up. It was healing to learn later that praying for “fun” things was not the purpose of observing practices such as Nine First Fridays, but spiritual goals such as healings, conversions, forgiveness, getting a job etc...


CHARISMATIC PRAYER GROUP


