

All are invited to recite the rosary after the 9:00am Mass. For those who can stay longer, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is also recited.


From the Administrator's Desk...

The first aspect of prayer, as I hoped made sense last week, is the *T word* of ACTS—*thanksgiving*—which is rooted in recognizing our Creator and Redeemer. This is the foundation, in turn, of the *A word*: *Adoration*. Where our hearts are, there is our treasure. If we live a life of gratitude, how could we not flow over into adoring the One Who has given us every reason to adore?

Among the primitive training our mothers provided was to say “thank you” upon receiving a gift or favor. Tragically, such training seems less prevalent today. Do you have the same reaction as I, when the check-out person say “Thank you”? When that basis for my “You’re welcome” is missing, I’m left oarless, not knowing how to conclude the encounter on a human and humane level. Or, consider the number of tissues we have to pick up off the church floor Mondays... The weak civility that characterizes our every day lives leads to an off-hand attitude toward God—if at all.

Amalarious of Metz got it right in the 9th Century: “How we pray determines how we live and behave”, and the obverse is equally true. We are not adoring God, when *respect* [= looking at closely] for all God is making and doing is lacking. At the top of this lift is undoubtedly our attitude toward every neighbor.

When we get the *A* and *T* straight—the *Adoration and Thanksgiving*—the *C* and *S* come into clearer focus: *Contrition* follows when we are aware of dishonoring God and God’s creation (with you-know-who first on the list). *Supplication*—praying *for*—follows as well: Right relationship with God and neighbor clarifies whom and what we should be praying *for*. Not the lottery, not the turn of the card, not the b-cycle; but what truly leads to eternal life: mine yours, our neighbor’s, the world’s.





ST. IGNATIUS FISCAL CORNER

This week we will take a quick look at Sunday collections. Weekly collections, as reported by area parishes for May 1st, 2016, were as follows: Queen of the Universe - \$16,932; St. Frances Cabrini - \$15,125; St. John the Evangelist - \$14,233; St. Michael the Archangel - \$11,486 and Holy Trinity - \$8,488. St. Andrews does not report their collections in their bulletin. St. Ignatius' collection for that weekend was \$13,725. Over the years, St. Ignatius averaged \$20,000 per week from 2005 to 2009, and \$18,000 per week from 2010 to 2015. This year, we are averaging \$15,200 per week in our Sunday collection. As you can see, it is a significant reduction in income and it is a driving factor that contributes to our parish debt. A \$3,000 reduction in our weekly collection results in an annual reduction of \$156,000. It is because of this reduction we will be unable to pay all of our obligations while maintaining our current debt level and as a result, will see an increase in our parish debt this fiscal year. Sunday contributions are the number one source of income for our parish and we are thankful and extremely grateful to our parishioners for their financial support. Your weekly gifts help St. Ignatius to fulfill its mission. As we enter the summer months we do see a reduction in weekly contributions. If you would consider donating online while you are away, or signing up for our ACH giving, that would go a long way to help us meet our financial obligations. 



SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND MAY 21ST AND MAY 22ND

Pope Francis has dedicated this year as a Jubilee Year of Mercy, asking us repeatedly to reach out and help the needy. ADULT FAITH FORMATION
