



AID FOR FRIENDS EXPLAINED LET'S DO LUNCH...DINNER...AND BREAKFAST...

I'm sure you have all heard the "Meals on Wheels" advertising slogan, "Let's Do Lunch!". Aid for Friends is the same concept, except Aid for Friends is always free to our "Friends" whereas "Meals on Wheels" charges for meals on a sliding scale. The people we serve in the greater Philadelphia area include ill and homebound individuals of all ages, and also the isolated, elderly population. Aid for Friends also provides more than lunch. We provide seven well-balanced meals per week plus soups, lunch bags and breakfast bags for those persons who request them. Aid for Friends also provides a trained "visitor" who goes once per week to stay for a visit. During the visit the welfare of the person is observed and recommendations may be made to the Aid for Friends social worker if conditions warrant intervention. It is not uncommon for our Aid for Friends visitors to become close friends with their client/friends. A close, rewarding personal bond forms.

Wouldn't you like to become a part of this organization? You can participate once per month at our meeting to assemble meals; or you can donate to help us continue our work; or you can become a visitor. Check us out at our next meeting to assemble meals on August 10th from 9 am – 12 noon in the church auditorium kitchen. 

In such cases, the Church will consider the divorced marriage to see if someone entered the marriage with an understanding, ability or intention contrary to the Church's teaching on marriage. This process, called a Declaration of Nullity, enables people to marry in the Catholic Church and enables Catholics to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church. We all experience suffering at some time in our lives. Our tribulations range from small disappointments to serious tragedies. Listen as scripture scholar and lay theologian, Dr. Scott Hahn, makes sense out of suffering by drawing from the wisdom and insight of God's Word. He helps us find the meaning of our suffering by showing us how to unite it to the suffering of Christ on the Cross.

August 2017 Reflection (Published by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia Office for the New Evangelization) Fatima Centennial Reflection: Mary's Perpetual Virginity

Sr. Lucia, one of the shepherd children to whom Our Lady appeared in Fatima, explained that Our Lady requested the First Saturdays devotion to repair the damage done by offenses against her Immaculate Heart. One of these offenses is the denial or mockery of Mary's perpetual virginity.

Catholics have believed from the very beginning of the Church that Mary remained a virgin throughout her entire life. Jesus was conceived in Mary through the power of the Holy Spirit and not through spousal relations. After the conception and birth of Jesus, Mary remained a virgin and never had sexual relations with a man. Now in heaven, body and soul, she continues to be Ever-Virgin. This is the dogma of Mary's perpetual virginity.

Why is the perpetual virginity of Mary so important to our faith? The Catechism teaches us that Our Lady's perpetual virginity anchors the truth that the incarnation of Jesus, that is, the Son of God taking on human flesh and becoming man, was wholly God's initiative. It was not a human action that brought it about, but God Himself. Along with this, Mary's perpetual virginity upholds the identity of Jesus as Son of the Eternal Father. Jesus has no father but God the Father. His virginal conception in Mary's womb reveals this.

Mary's perpetual virginity also reveals to us the profoundly intimate and tender way that God relates to us. When God acted upon Mary and the Son of God took flesh in her womb, her virginity remained intact. This teaches us that when God relates to us, it is always with deep reverence for our nature. Far from being a violent or disruptive action, God's manner of coming near to us is always a healing, preserving, and integrating experience.

Our Lady's virginity, maintained throughout her entire life, expresses in her body her perfect and sustained union with God. Mary's "yes" to God in the annunciation was a total and unreserved gift of herself to Him. Through her "yes," Mary made both her soul and body completely available to His plan. Our Lady's perpetual virginity is the sign that Mary continues, throughout her earthly life and in her heavenly existence, to be she is who wholly given over to God with an undivided heart and a body that belongs only to God. Let us ask Our Lady, through her perpetual virginity, to obtain for us an ever-deeper purity in our bodily actions and an increasingly undivided heart wholly given over to God and His plans!
