

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NEWS

Many are aware that the USO was formed in 1941 for our Service personnel. Did you know that in the First World War the Knights of Columbus set up huts in Military Camps both here at home and abroad. The sign on the huts read "EVERYONE WELCOME...EVERYTHING FREE" They continued this after the war in all areas where we had camps for the Military. In the thirties they added entertainment to the huts. The Knights looked after our Military for years before the USO was operating. Were the Knights responsible for the USO starting we'll never know, but we know that the Knights were there for our troops long before the USO and hopefully played a part in the start of the USO.

Today the Knights are always supporting our troops by having Councils in many camps around the World. They also support the Troops by having Councils like our own who provide funding to a local group of ladies who knit hats scarves and socks to send to the military in far away bases where the weather is not kind. (Our Council provides \$1,200 per year to these ladies for supplies and shipping of these materials.)
