

CONSECRATION OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF PHILADELPHIA TO THE BLESSED MOTHER

The Bishops of Pennsylvania voted to approve a recommendation that each Catholic diocese and eparchy in the Commonwealth be dedicated to the Blessed Mother in honor of the 100th Anniversary of the apparition of the Blessed Mother at Fatima.

The official dedication will be marked with a special Mass to be celebrated in Saint Patrick Cathedral in Harrisburg at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, September 27 by all bishops in the state.

The second part of the dedication will be an observance in each diocese. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia will be consecrated to Our Lady on the weekend of October 14-15 at the Cathedral in Philadelphia. More details are coming soon.

A society will be judged on the basis of how it treats its weakest members; and among the most vulnerable are surely the unborn and the dying.

This week is traditionally known as "NFP Awareness Week" and celebrates the 49th anniversary of the Blessed Pope Paul VI encyclical "Donum Vitae" (the Gospel of Life) enunciating the ongoing and constant teaching of the Catholic Church on the sanctity of life and life, the meaning of love and intimacy and the teaching promoting natural family planning and against contraception. Unfortunately, most Catholics today do not accept this teaching- mostly because they don't understand the meaning of life and love and babies and bonding. Reading this document would certainly help their discernment.

The Respect Life committee has donated thousands of dollars of donations from generous parishioners from St. Ignatius to support the Alliance NFP Network. Our parish also has two certified instructors willing to teach NFP at any time. Further, the Couple to Couple League (ccli.org) has online courses.

Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.


