

AID FOR FRIENDS EXPLAINED

LET'S DO LUNCH...DINNER...AND BREAKFAST...

I'm sure you have all heard the "Meals on Wheels" advertising slogan, "Let's Do Lunch!". Aid for Friends is the same concept, except Aid for Friends is always free to our "Friends" whereas "Meals on Wheels" charges for meals on a sliding scale. The people we serve in the greater Philadelphia area include ill and homebound individuals of all ages, and also the isolated, elderly population. Aid for Friends also provides more than lunch. We provide seven well-balanced meals per week plus soups, lunch bags and breakfast bags for those persons who request them. Aid for Friends also provides a trained "visitor" who goes once per week to stay for a visit. During the visit the welfare of the person is observed and recommendations may be made to the Aid for Friends social worker if conditions warrant intervention. It is not uncommon for our Aid for Friends visitors to become close friends with their client/friends. A close, rewarding personal bond forms. Wouldn't you like to become a part of this organization? You can participate once per month at our meeting to assemble meals; or you can donate to help us continue our work; or you can become a visitor. Check us out at our next meeting to assemble meals on July 13^{th} from 9 am -12 noon in the church auditorium kitchen.
