

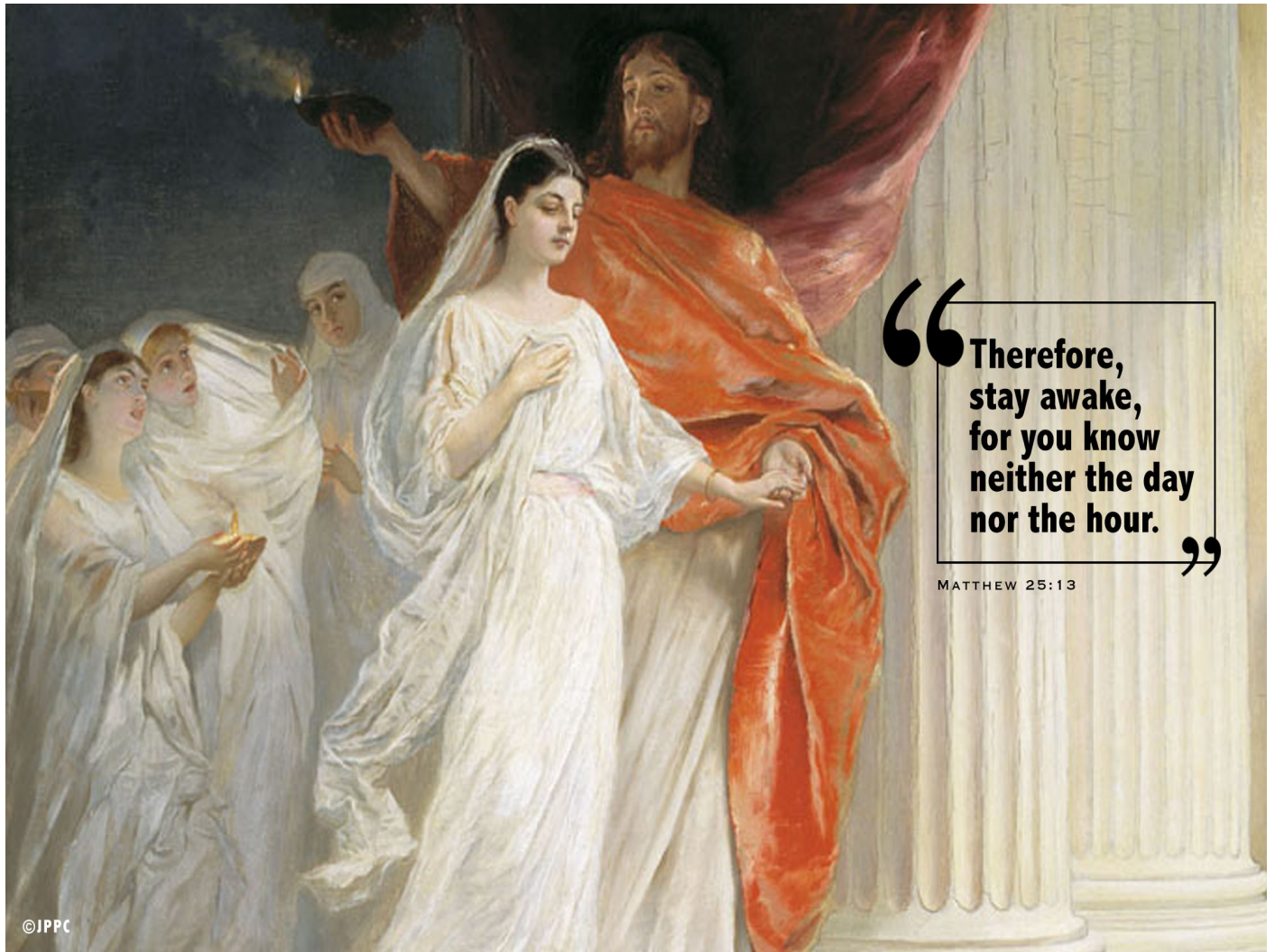

FISCAL CORNER

As you know, we are having a weekly drawing called the “Monday Morning Madness” raffle. Each Monday we will draw a lucky ticket for a fixed cash prize. There will only be 1,000 tickets available and can be purchased through the end of December. 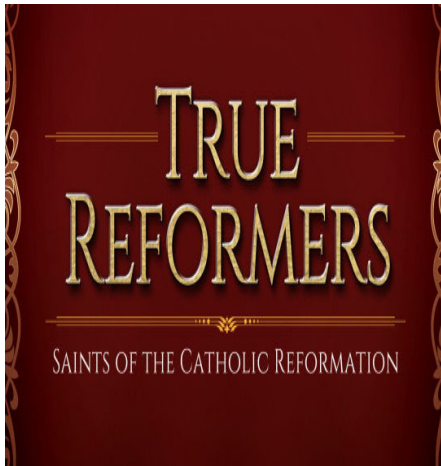
