

#### 2018-2019 Annual Parish Appeal

As of our eighth full week of the Parish appeal, 226 families have contributed \$90,075 toward our goal of \$160,000. We are at 56.30% of this year's goal. Thank you for your generosity!

This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. You should have received our appeals materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church.
