

SOCIAL ACTION COMMITTEE

Pope Francis continues to call on us to reach out to the poor, as "we all have a duty to do good." Our recent assistance to the Advocates for the Homeless provided warm and weatherproof clothing which was desperately needed by 30 individuals. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast. The law of fast binds those who are from 18 to 59 years old, unless they are excused for a sufficient reason (e.g., a medical condition that requires more frequent food, etc.). According to the

Church's official rules (as opposed to someone's personal summary of them): The law of fasting allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food in the morning and evening, observing—as far as quantity and quality are concerned—approved local custom [Apostolic Constitution Paenitemini, Norms, III:2]. The system of mitigated fasting that is required by law thus allows for "one full meal" and "some food" in the morning and evening. The Church's official document governing the practice of fasting does not encourage scrupulous calculations about how much the two instances of "some food" add up to, though obviously each individually is less than a full meal, since only one of those is allowed. Our programs are about education and growth, growth in faith and awareness of God. Inform yourselves, you will be glad you did... and, so will God. St. Thomas Aquinas pray for us.

Rose of Life Intention: For all those who suffer, may they be relieved.

"Whether it lasts for a brief moment or for a hundred years, each of our lives is a good and perfect gift. At every stage and in every circumstance, we are held in existence by God's love. ... Every life is worth living."

Our lives are a good and perfect gift because God created us out of love, for love to be loved and His plan for salvation and love has a place and purpose for all of us. If we thwart God's plan for life and love, babies and the future we interfere with His plan and assume that WE know better, that WE are gods. Again, we need to search our lives, look within ourselves and listen to God; He know best.


