FISCAL CORNER

On June 7th, auditors representing the Archdiocese of Philadelphia conducted an audit of St. Ignatius of Antioch Parish. The auditors examined the records from both the school and the church. Aside from a couple of procedural issues, no major inconsistencies were found. Recommendations were made on the procedures for entering data in our Sunday collection online data system, minor employee record keeping updates and the documentation needed to be kept on file for the tracking of restricted funds. We have accepted those recommendations, as well as adopting the newly recommended cash income and expenditure procedures as outlined by the Archdiocese Office of Financial Services. There are divorced persons who seek to remarry in the Catholic Church. In such cases, the Church will consider the divorced marriage to see if someone entered the marriage with an understanding, ability or intention contrary to the Church's teaching on marriage. This process, called a Declaration of Nullity, enables people to marry in the Catholic Church and enables Catholics to participate fully in the sacramental life of the Church. When Humanae Vitae was released, it was in response to a Papal commission convened during Vatican II by Pope St. John XXIII and expanded by Blessed Pope Paul VI. Their report, after years of discussion, debate, investigation and prayer was to 'relax' the Church's teaching on contraception.

This is known as the 'majority' report. A 'minority' report was also produced with Bishop Karol Wojtyla as an author recommending against any change in teaching. On July 25, the feast of St. James, the encyclical was released. It spoke of the requirement to maintain the two meaningful elements of the marital act, the unitive and the procreative. Contraception separates the procreative and this violates the intrinsic nature of the union and is thus intrinsically evil. If we are to respect life, we must respect the creative act of life.
