In the interest of adult education, we would like you to know that this is Natural Family Planning Week and the 50th Anniversary of the encyclical Humane Vitae by Blessed Pope Paul VI on Church teaching on contraception and natural family planning. This particular

topic is one that is little understood by many, including most Catholics. As a beginning place to start, try reading the encyclical- it is free at Vatican.org. To find out more about NFP (natural family planning) go to CoupletoCoupleLeague.org and read an explanation and, if interested, sign up for an online class. There are many who struggle with this Catholic Church teaching, but the struggle is because there is a misunderstanding of what is involved, the methods and the teaching. Further, contraception is not authentic women's healthcare and in this era of 'organic' and 'green' and 'environmentally friendly', NFP provides the answer, and, it works. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.



This is the beginning of "Natural Family Planning Awareness" week. When was the last time you heard a homily on natural family planning or the Church's teaching on contraception? Possibly never. This week is marked by the 50th anniversary of Humane Vitae. It also celebrates the feasts of St.

James and the feast of Sts. Anne and Joachim, the grandparents of Jesus. If you don't know what natural family planning(NFP) is, go to ccli.org the website of the Couple to Couple league. It is the only acceptable method of family planning per the Catholic Church; is very inexpensive; is easy to learn; is 98-99% effective; has no side effects and does not separate the unitive and procreative aspects of the marital embrace. NFP is not 'Catholic contraception' as it is not 'contra' anything but uses the natural changes in a woman's cycle to allow to achieve or postpone pregnancy. It is God's gift.

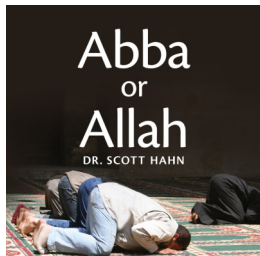

H.O.P.E. is a group of concerned parishioners who are willing to help anyone in the geographical boundaries of our parish.

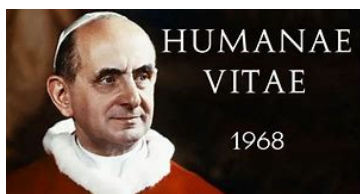
