What we CANNOT do:

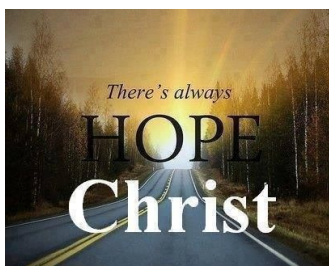
