FISCAL CORNER

As we approach the end of fiscal year 2018 (ending on June 30th), we will take a look at the parish debt. This past year we were able to keep current with all Archdiocesan responsibilities, including parish assessments, liability and insurance premiums. In addition we were able to pay all prior year liability and insurance obligations owed to the Archdiocese, totaling \$134,323 in prior year obligations. As you may recall, the proceeds from the land sale were used in fiscal year 2017 to pay off all prior year assessments owed. The current parish debt as of June 30th 2018 now stands at \$1,060,677. That obligation to the Archdiocese includes principal owed on the loan for the building of the parish center (\$621,588) and overdue interest on that loan (\$439,089). We have budgeted \$80,000 for next fiscal year to begin to address that obligation. Thank you to everyone who financially supports our parish which allows us to address our debt, maintain our level of services, support our school, and make the much needed improvements around the parish property. 
