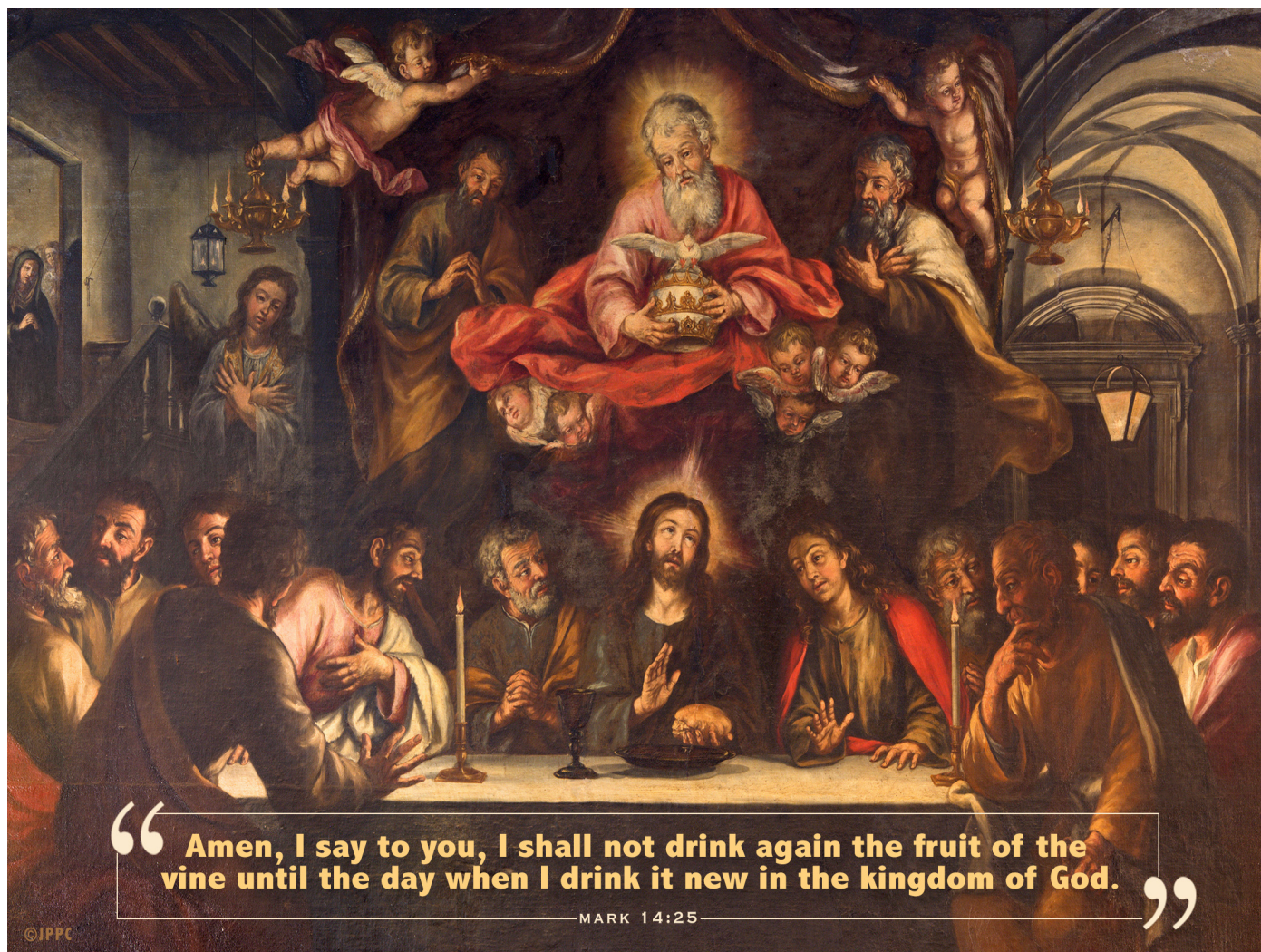

## FISCAL CORNER

Last May I reached out to you, our parishioners, to ask for help making improvements to our Church and to our parish. This request came in the form of an increased offertory appeal. This program encouraged every parishioner to reflect upon the gifts they are making to their Church and to make a decision to provide regular, consistent support to their parish through the Sunday offertory. As you can see by the financial reports in the parish bulletin, we have realized an increase in our Sunday offering as a direct result of our increased offertory program. We have seen an average weekly increase since the program was launched of approximately 20% for an average collection increase of around \$3,000 per week! Without your help, none of the recent improvements to our Church and Parish grounds would have been possible, but we have much more to do. If you have made the commitment to increase your giving, we sincerely thank you. If you could not at the time of our appeal, maybe now would be a better time for you to consider an increase in your Sunday giving. Because of the needs of our parish, and the cost of expanding our programs, I am hoping that you will be willing to look at your offertory giving and see how you might be able to help St. Ignatius in the coming months. My hope is that you'll be willing to examine your giving to our offertory and after prayerful consideration, make a decision about your future support. I realize any increase in your giving will involve both a sharing of your blessings and a sacrifice. I appeal to your generosity, and I will be grateful for whatever gift you decide is appropriate. Great things are happening here at St. Ignatius and I am excited for our future! Thank you for helping to make St. Ignatius a vibrant, active and loving community. – Fr. Brownholtz
