FISCAL CORNER

Our 2018-2019 Annual Parish Appeal is underway! This critical parish financial appeal will run from October through the end of January. This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. You should have received our appeals materials in the mail. If you have not, there are appeal envelopes located in the entrances of the church. Please return your donation by placing this year's appeal envelope in the collection basket at Mass. You may also mail your contribution or drop it off directly to the rectory.

As of our third full week of the Parish appeal, 134 families have contributed \$47,780 toward our goal of \$160,000. We are at 29.86% of this year's goal. Thank you for your generosity!

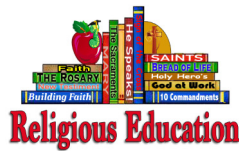
