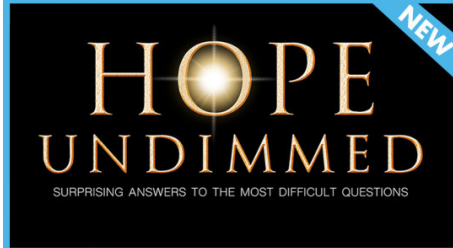

On Sunday, October 14th, our Parish will begin its Annual Forty Hours Eucharistic Devotion after the 11:30 Mass. Evening prayer will conclude our day on Sunday at 7:00 PM, Monday at 7:00 PM and Tuesday at 7:00 PM. Our solemn closing of the Forty Hours on Tuesday evening will include a candle-light procession outside of the church ending with a reception in our school cafeteria.

Sunday Night, October 14th at 7PM - *Jesus is the same yesterday.*

Our Faith has not popped out of nowhere, but rather is deeply grounded in history. Salvation History shows us how from the first moments of human existence God has sought a relationship with us. This started at the covenants with Abraham, Moses, and David. It continued with the prophets and culminated in the coming of Christ. Christ is the fulfillment of Old Testament law, sacrifice and prophets. Christ entered at a moment in history and is a historical reality.

Monday Night, October 15th at 7PM - *Jesus is the same today.*

Although Christ is a historical person, he is very much alive and with us today. Christ is with us most especially in the Eucharist. At every Mass, we too get to be present on Calvary. Though Christ is also present to us in His Word (Sacred Scripture) and in the love that we share with one another. We need to invite God into our lives, knowing that the way we are able to carry our daily crosses and trials is through God's grace.

Tuesday Night, October 16th at 7PM - *Jesus is the same forever.*

God is constant, he is immutable. This means God does not change, he is the same yesterday, today, and forever. We don't have to worry about God changing, becoming different or abandoning us. God love us no matter what. It is we who remove ourselves from God's love by our sin. We must grow in our trust of God and His providence. 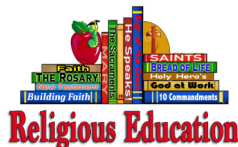
