



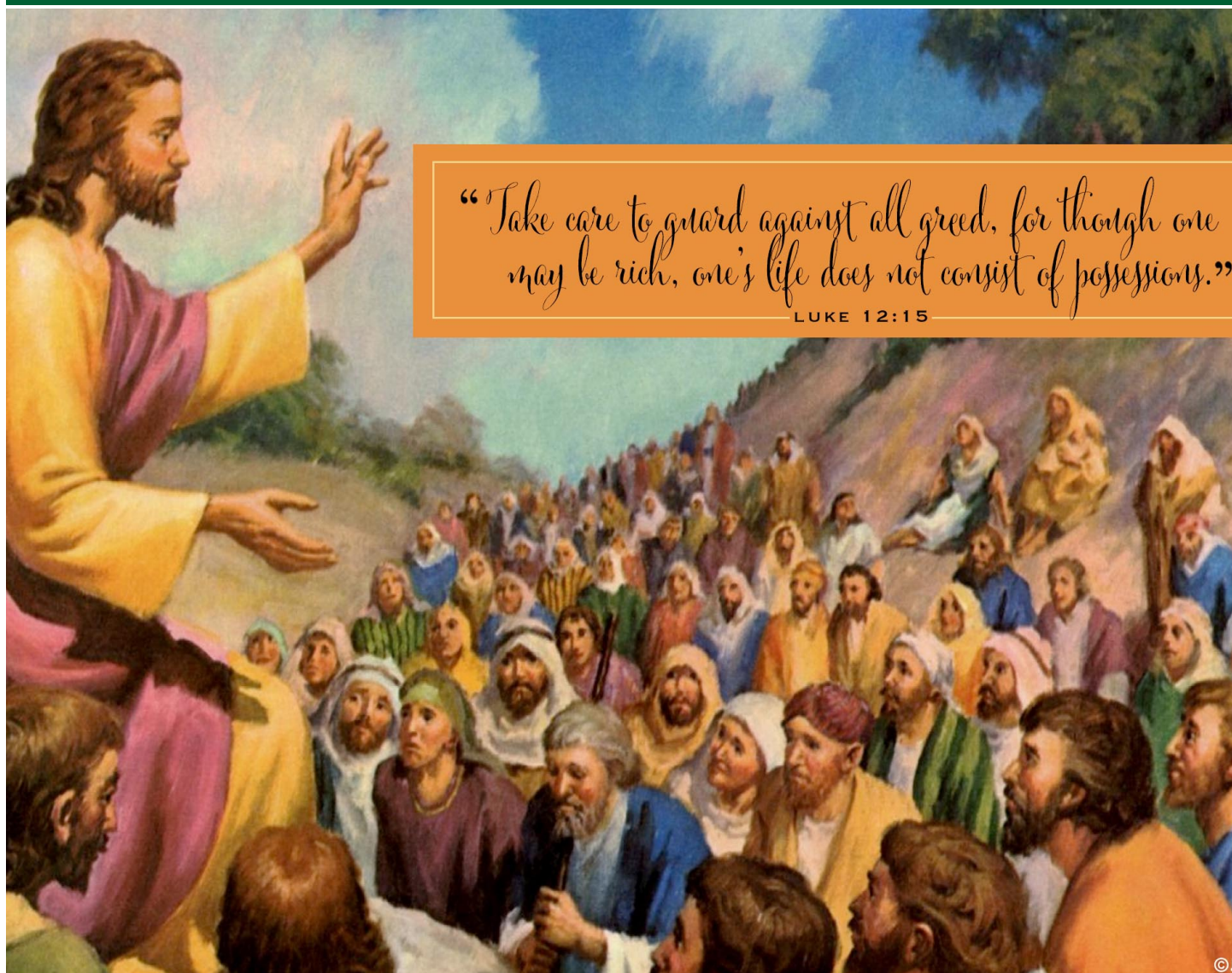

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23

This book begins with a famous negative: "All things are vanity." The author describes a man who delights in the fruits of his labor, but then becomes frustrated when he realizes that he must leave it all to somebody else.

Reading II: Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Paul reminds his readers that we love all others in Christ, and then he lists the sins of the community. He also tells them that what makes us virtuous is how we live out our baptism.

The Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

This section begins a long reflection on the negative effects that possessions can have on us. Our Lord cites greed as a problem yet endorsed by false teachers. He then tells one of His masterful parables.

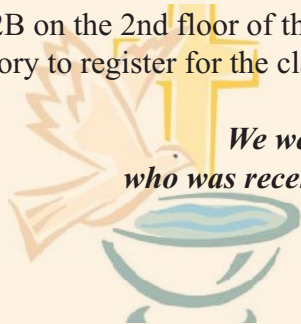

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Do you know the Holy Days of Obligation? Have they changed since you learned them?

There are six Holy Days of Obligation in 2019, although the number varies from year to year. The number varies because the obligation is lifted if any of the days falls on either a Saturday or a Monday. The six days are:

1 January: Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God

30 May: Ascension of Jesus

15 August: Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

1 November: All Saints' Day

9 December: the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary (usually 12/8)

25 December: Christmas

Two are past and one is coming in 11 days, the rest later in the year.

This is the type of teaching one can learn from our programs. Our very first program on Saturday, Sept. 28, 2019 offered by our very own Deacon Bob Skawinski and his personal testimony of having seen Jesus; if you haven't read his book or heard his story, this is your opportunity to hear a first hand account of an 'in person' encounter with Jesus. Religious Education

From the Religious Education Office...

During the month of August, the Religious Education Office opens at 9:30 a.m. from Monday through Thursday, and the office opens on Sunday by request.

PREP registrations can be mailed or dropped off at the PREP Office or at the rectory. You can download information and the registration form (1 form per child please) on the Parish website (www.stignatius.church).

Click on PREP. Since July 1, the regular tuition cost applies.

If you are new to the parish or will have children entering kindergarten or grade 1 in the fall, we will also need a copy of your child(ren)'s Baptismal certificate unless he/she was baptized here at St. Ignatius Church. Our Religious Education program is open to students in grades K through 8.

GRADE 8 Students: Parents, please encourage your 8th grade students to continue Religious Education after Confirmation. Confirmation is a beginning – not an ending.

“Special Needs” Class: Parents, are you aware that we have a special needs class that meets during the Wednesday PREP time at 6:30 p.m.? This class is for those students who would benefit from a very small group learning experience.

PREP CLASSES BEGIN ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 8; MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 9; and WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 11.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: Parents, please don't be afraid to volunteer. We always need Catechists, Classroom Aides, and Door Monitors. In August, new Catechists participate in a Catechist Orientation Course, so you will not begin teaching “cold turkey.” Think it over and pray about it. We have several Catechists who have worked in our program for many years; it is truly a rewarding experience, and our students are great kids.

SACRAMENTS:

CONFIRMATION: Students in grade 7, who have been in Religious Education classes for several years, will prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this year.

FIRST RECONCILIATION and FIRST COMMUNION: Students usually receive these Sacraments in grade 2 after they have completed the grade 1 curriculum.

Parents, if your child has not been in Religious Education classes consistently, and you want him/her to receive the Sacraments, please speak with Annmarie (215-493-5204). We do make accommodations. No child will ever be refused.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- *Spiritual Site for Final Resting* - The principal benefit a Columbarium affords church members and their families the opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives, a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.
- *Simplicity of Planning* - The purchase of a Columbarium niche eliminates the pressures of choosing a burial site, casket, vault and monument; also, there is no need to plan for inurnment and memorial services at different locations and times.
- *Substantial Financial Savings* - With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.

How much does a niche cost?

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000
 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750
 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following:
 Burial rights in the niche
 Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs:
 To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains
 Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300

How can I arrange to purchase a niche?

You may contact the Rectory at 215-493-3377 to make an appointment to purchase. Upon final payment, a certificate covering inurnment ownership rights will be sent to the purchaser of the niche.
