Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 10, 2019

First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8

Following last weekend's story of the call of Jeremiah, here we read of the call of Isaiah. Such call stories justify to contemporaries the prophet's teaching, which was often unpopular. "Lips touched" means the whole person is.

Second Reading: I Corinthians 15:1-11, or 15:3-8, 11

Here is the Church's Creed at its heart, with her belief in the resurrection of Jesus as primary. Paul mentions that eyewitnesses to the post-resurrection appearances were still living and available for questioning.

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

Jesus receives the first positive response to His kingdom message. Recall the very negative one offered by His hometown crowd. Peter, whose boat Jesus significantly uses, is awed by the miraculous catch of fish, and is told of his future, in which he will "catch" men.



Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance. Please call the rectory to make an appointment with one of the priests.


FISCAL CORNER


