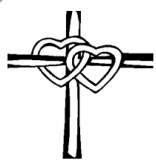

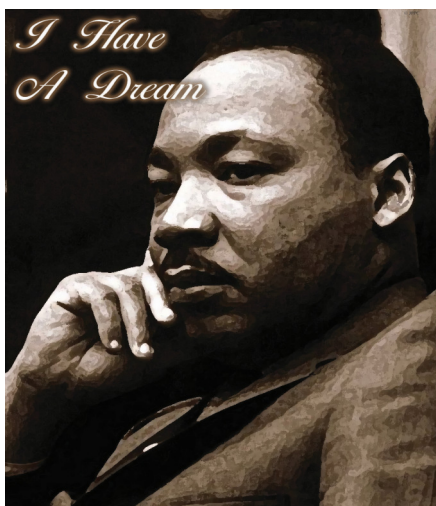

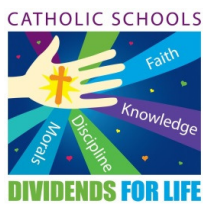

Open House for new families will follow Mass in school from 12:30 until 2:00PM.

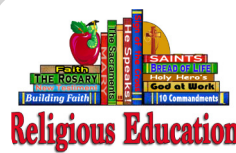
