

First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

The Law is not some abstract idea in a foreign language. Rather, it is a commonly worded set of practical truths residing in one's heart that is recited at every festival.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:15-20

These verses are commonly held to be an early Church hymn. The words speak of the role of Christ in the creation of all things.

Gospel: Luke 10:25-37

Here we have a powerful lesson about mercy toward those in need combined with a proclamation that all non-Jews can observe the law and so enter into eternal life.

St. Kateri Tekakwitha Pray for us! Feast Day: July 14th

St. Kateri Tekakwitha has been named by the Church as a patron of Native Americans, of ecologists, and of people ridiculed for their piety.

As demonstrated by St. Kateri, Christianity does require per-

sonal sacrifice, and it does require converts to be open to a new way of life. But, as Kateri shows us, acceptance of Christianity does not mean a renunciation of those aspects of our lives that prepared us to be attracted to Christ in the first place. Rather, God's grace builds upon nature, and all that is good and true and life-giving in our families and culture can be transformed, in a sense "baptized," right along with us.

From the Religious Education Office...

The Religious Education Office is closed during the month of July. It will reopen on August 1.

PREP registrations can be mailed or dropped off at the rectory. You can download information and the registration form (1 form per child please) on Religious Education the Parish website (www.stignatius.church). Since July 1, the regular tuition cost applies. Click on PREP.

If you are new to the parish or will have children entering kindergarten or grade 1 in the fall, we will also need a copy of your child(ren)'s Baptismal certificate unless he/she was baptized here at St. Ignatius Church. Our Religious Education program is open to students in grades K through 8.

GRADE 8 Students: Parents, please encourage your 8th grade students to continue Religious Education after Confirmation. Confirmation is a beginning – not an ending.

"Special Needs" Class: Parents, are you aware that we have a special needs class that meets during the Wednesday PREP time at 6:30 p.m.? This class is for those students who would benefit from a very small group learning experience.

PREP CLASSES BEGIN ON SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 8; MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 9; and WEDNES-DAY, SEPTEMBER 11.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED: Parents, please don't be afraid to volunteer. We always need Catechists, Classroom Aides, and Door Monitors. In August, new Catechists participate in a Catechist Orientation Course, so you will not begin teaching "cold turkey." Think it over and pray about it. We have several Catechists who have worked in our program for many years; it is truly a rewarding experience, and our students are great kids.

SACRAMENTS:

CONFIRMATION: Students in grade 7, who have been in Religious Education classes for several years, will prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this year.

FIRST RECONCILIATION and FIRST COMMUNION: Students usually receive these Sacraments in grade 2 after they have completed the grade 1 curriculum.

Parents, if your child has not been in Religious Education classes consistently, and you want him/her to receive the Sacraments, please speak with Annmarie (215-493-5204). We do make accommodations. No child will ever be refused.

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300

How can I arrange to purchase a niche?

You may contact the Rectory at 215-493-3377 to make an appointment to purchase. Upon final payment, a certificate covering inumment ownership rights will be sent to the purchaser of the niche.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- Spiritual Site for Final Resting The principal benefit a
 Columbarium affords church members and their families the
 opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish
 cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives,
 a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones
 can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.
- Simplicity of Planning The purchase of a Columbarium niche eliminates the pressures of choosing a burial site, casket, vault and monument; also, there is no need to plan for inurnment and memorial services at different locations and times.
- Substantial Financial Savings With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.
