First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Paul writes the criterion for anyone saying "Jesus is Lord." He then delineates the various gifts that people may have, all of them derived from the same Holy Spirit. The Church, like our body, is one entity with many parts.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus' appearance to the disciples in Jerusalem shows that He kept His promise to return to them. Displaying His scarred hands and side identifies Him further to the baffled group. Jesus then empowers them to bestow the Holy Spirit on all the believers.

Today we celebrate Pentecost Sunday. So what is the BIG deal? Pentecost is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is cele-

brated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter (the name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth"). It is also called Whitsun, but does not necessarily coincide with the Whitsun Bank Holiday in the UK. Pentecost. In the New Testament, the day that the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples of Jesus. Pentecost is the Greek name for Shavuot, the spring harvest festival of the Israelites, which was going on when the Holy Spirit came. The Seven gifts of the Holy Spirit are an enumeration of seven spiritual gifts originating from patristic authors, later elaborated by five intellectual virtues and four other groups of ethical characteristics. They are: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord. Let us all pray that we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit and have new life through the Spirit and that, like the Apostles, will receive the gift of speaking the Truth in Love as designated by Our Lord.



Educational Improvement Tax Credit Program

You Can Make A Significant Difference (at no cost to you) To A Child Seeking A Catholic Education.

The Archdiocese of Philadelphia participates in the EITC Program. EITC stands for Educational Improvement Tax Credit. This program allows all Pennsylvania residents to direct their state tax dollars to an educational institution. I ask you to consider directing your Pennsylvania tax dollars to St. Ignatius School. This will help families, who desire a Catholic education for their children, to obtain it here at St. Ignatius School.

How Does It Work?

The Foundation for Catholic Education in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia (a non-for-profit organization supporting Elementary Education in the Philadelphia Archdiocese) has formed a "Special Purpose Entity," (a legal entity created to fulfill a specific objective such as funding Catholic Education) which will consolidate all individuals who want to apply to have their PA state taxes directed to Catholic Schools and they will apply to the state on our behalf.

Anyone who pays state taxes can participate and take full advantage of the PA EITC programs.

- Apply the credit for your personal PA Taxes
- Receive a 90% tax credit for a 2 year commitment
- Designate St. Ignatius School as your recipient

Business Participation
