Reading I: Samuel 5: 1-3

David meets with all 12 tribes of Israel at Hebron. There the leaders quote to him the Lord's wish that he shepherd the people. David accepts their proposal and is their anointed king.

Reading II: Colossians 1: 12-20

After verses about coming to the light and forgiveness of sins, the rest of this passage is most likely a primitive Christian hymn beginning "He is the image of the invisible God."

The Gospel: Luke 23: 35-43

The final hours of Our Lord's earthly life lead us to consider the kind of King He was, even though He never wanted that title. It had everything to do with a gentle but firm hold on our hearts.

FISCAL CORNER


