Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: II Kings 5: 14-17

Yahweh heals the powerful Naaman at Elisha's request. The prophet then refuses to accept Naaman's gift because to do so would mean he worked the cure and not God. Naaman wants to take home soil based on the pagan belief that gods only operated in certain lands.

Reading II: II Timothy 2: 8-13

Paul provides a brief credal statement and then we receive a part of an ancient hymn that was sung in churches he had founded.

The Gospel: Luke 17: 11-19

Jesus, en route to Jerusalem, where He will complete His mission and fulfill the Father's will, arrives at Samaria. There he meets ten lepers, whom He proceeds to heal. But only one cured person returns to thank Him, and he is a Samaritan, so hated by the Jews of Our Lord's time. They are indirectly indicted for their hatred.

Saint Ignatius of Antioch's Story

Born in Syria, Ignatius converted to Christianity and eventually became bishop of Antioch. In the year 107, Emperor Trajan visited Antioch and forced the Christians there to choose between death and apostasy. Ignatius would not deny Christ and thus was condemned to be put to death in Rome. Ignatius is well known for the seven letters he wrote on the long journey from Antioch to Rome. Five of these letters are to churches in Asia Minor; they urge the Christians there to remain faithful to God and to obey their superiors. He warns them against heretical doctrines, providing them with the solid truths of the Christian faith.

The sixth letter was to Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, who was later martyred for the faith. The final letter begs the Christians in Rome not to try to stop his martyrdom. "The only thing I ask of you is to allow me to offer the libation of my blood to God. I am the wheat of the Lord; may I be ground by the teeth of the beasts to become the immaculate bread of Christ."

Ignatius bravely met the lions in the Circus Maximus.

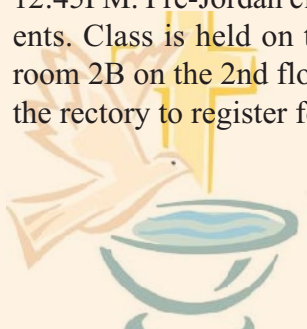

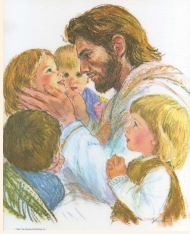

ADULT Faith FORMATION

This is Respect Life Month. If you always wanted to know what the Church teaches with respect to life, one very easy source is to read *Theology of the Body for Dummies* by Christopher West. *Theology of the Body* is a series of 129 talks presented by Pope St. JP II during the first five years of his papacy to reflect on human sexuality and the meaning of the body, i.e. why DO we have bodies; God in His Trinity does not have a body (no counting that Jesus took on our humanity to save us); angels don't have bodies; they are the only 'beings' besides us and, yet, we DO have a body. We are not embodied spirits; our bodies are an integral part of who we are. Our bodies are so important that after the Second Coming, we get them back in a 'risen form' for all of eternity! Amazing. So, we need to respect life; we need to respect our body; the old Baltimore catechism taught that our body is a Temple of the Holy Spirit... you know, 'the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son'! So, let us educate ourselves ongoing; read the Bible; read Catholic documents like *Humane Vitae* and *Evangelium Vitae* both by St. JP II. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

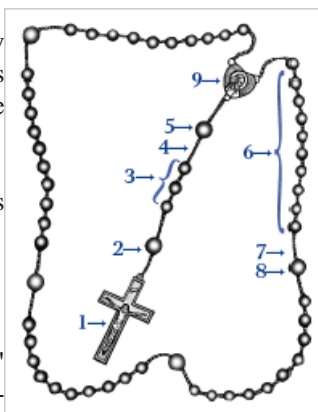

HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY

On the 5 decades (sets of 10 beads) of a rosary, we pray and meditate on the corresponding set of 5 Mysteries from the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, the Glorious Mysteries, or the Luminous Mysteries.

1. Make the Sign of the Cross and say the "Apostles Creed."
2. Say the "Our Father."
3. Say three "Hail Marys."
4. Say the "Glory be to the Father."
5. Announce the First Mystery; then say the "Our Father."
6. Say ten "Hail Marys," while meditating on the Mystery.
7. Say the "Glory be to the Father." After each decade say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy."
8. Announce the Second Mystery; then say the "Our Father." Repeat 6 and 7 and continue with the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.
9. Say the 'Hail, Holy Queen' on the medal after the five decades are completed.

DEDICATE THE RECTORY CHAPEL CANDLE FOR 2019 OR CHURCH SANCTUARY CANDLE FOR 2020

The red Sanctuary Lamp by the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.
