October 27, 2019 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Sirach 35: 12-14, 16-18

God certainly does "hear the cry of the poor" (Responsorial Psalm), but also that of the orphan and the widow, who are special and privileged characters in the Bible.

Reading II: II Timothy 4: 6-8, 16-18

The author of this letter (not actually St. Paul) imagines Paul's death as imminent, and so he hands over his work to Timothy his beloved friend. He tells Timothy that he was never abandoned by the Lord and awaits heaven.

The Gospel: Luke 18: 9-14

Luke continues here his steady depiction of the unrighteous, as personified by the Pharisees. The tax collector "beats his breast" (a sign of repentance) and then utters a short prayer for mercy. Its beautiful words make for an Act of Contrition for all of us.

The Church Sanctuary Candle burns in memory of John J. Gordon requested by Mary Gordon.



Feast of All Saints
November 1st

This feast first honored martyrs. Later, when Christians were free to worship according to their consciences, the Church acknowledged other paths to sanctity. In the early centuries the only criterion was popular acclaim, even when the bishop's approval became the final step in placing a commemoration on the calendar. The first papal canonization occurred in 993; the lengthy process now required to prove extraordinary sanctity took form in the last 500 years. Today's feast honors the obscure as well as the famous—the saints each of us have known.

This is one of our largest sources of income, aside from our normal Sunday collections, and is greatly needed for the daily operation of our parish. VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD



HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY

On the 5 decades (sets of 10 beads) of a rosary, we pray and meditate on the corresponding set of 5 Mysteries from the Joyful Mysteries, the Sorrowful Mysteries, the Glorious Mysteries, or the Luminous Mysteries.

- 1. Make the Sign of the Cross and say the "Apostles Creed."
- 2. Say the "Our Father."
- 3. Say three "Hail Marys."
- 4. Say the "Glory be to the Father."
- 5. Announce the First Mystery; then say the "Our Father."
- 6. Say ten "Hail Marys," while meditating on the Mystery.
- 7. Say the "Glory be to the Father." After each decade say the following prayer requested by the Blessed Virgin Mary at Fatima: "O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of Thy mercy."
- 8. Announce the Second Mystery: then say the "Our Father." Repeat 6 and 7 and continue with the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Mysteries in the same manner.
- 9. Say the 'Hail, Holy Queen' on the medal after the five decades are completed.
