September 8, 2019 Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Wisdom 9: 13-18

This selection is the third part of Solomon's prayer. He believed that we cannot know God's counsel because we have a weakened understanding that is brought on by our weak physical nature.

Reading II: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Paul pleads with Philemon to take back his former slave Onesimus but in a new way, not only because he has become close to Paul, almost like a son, but also because he has been converted to Christ and baptized.

The Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33

The demands of discipleship are spelled out here in a way that is unique to Luke's gospel. It is a total commitment of one's self to Christ, and demands loyalty to Him to the end. It may even entail loss of everything else.


7th National Day of Remembrance of Aborted Children
