The Archdiocese of Philadelphia announced that Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez has suspended all public Masses in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia effective at 12:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 18th and until further notice. The Archbishop dispensed the faithful from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Both decisions were made in response to the growing concern over the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and the directives provided by government and health department officials at the local, state, and national levels. These measures will be re-evaluated pending future developments. 
FISCAL CORNER



We offered two new programs this year and both were mini-retreats and both were a great success. The first was offered by Fr. Taglianetti. Over 55 attendees enjoyed his beautiful reflections on the Joyful Mysteries

of the Rosary with both visual and musical accompaniment. Fr.'s words were well spoken and all were happy to re-visit with him while they enjoyed a free continental breakfast. This program was a great preparation for the season of Advent. In the same genre, Fr. Brian Kean, principal at St. JPII HS in Paoli, joined us for an offering before Lent. Again, we had over 50 in attendance and he gave great teachings on suffering, sacrifice, forgiveness and love and the meaning of the Lenten season. We also had a great free continental breakfast and a great preparation for the season of Lent.

Our Community of Disciples again began its weekly small meetings to discern weekly Scripture readings with faith sharing; this program is also over 20 years running, having started as 'Ashes to Easter' back in the 1990's! Many of the groups have stayed together over the years.

We plan on offering these programs again NEXT year, but will hold off on announcing the leaders of the retreats just to whet your appetites! Happy Resurrection and end of Lenten sacrifices; be safe and pray for an end to those suffering from the viral pandemic. We shall prevail through the grace of God.

Respect "Those who die in God's grace and friendship live forever with Christ. Heaven is not an abstract idea, but a true and lasting relationship with God that is beyond all earthly description and understanding. We look forward to the resurrection of the dead and everlasting life by preparing now, in hope, for our passage from this life into eternal life."

Today is Easter Sunday; better known as the feast of the Resurrection of the Lord. THIS is the victory; this is the freedom from spiritual death back to life in Heaven. April 12, 2020 Easter Sunday

Reading I: Acts 10: 34a; 37-43

Peter, in the house of Cornelius, acts as a missionary in preaching this sermon about his Lord Jesus. He presents the core message of Christianity: The risen Jesus is the One who is to judge the living and the dead with mercy.

Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4

Here is the foundation for the behavioral instructions that follow. Jesus now sits "at the right hand of God," which was an early Church expression naming Jesus as the promised messiah. Paul adds that believers "will appear with Him in glory."

The Gospel: Matthew 28: 1-10

Mary Magdalene reports to Peter and the Beloved Disciple (John?) of her pre-dawn discovery of the empty tomb. Out of his respect for Peter, the younger "Beloved Disciple" waits to enter the tomb until after the older man has. Both came to understand that Jesus "had to rise from the dead."


