

August 16, 2020 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 56: 1, 6-7

Foreigners, or Gentiles, living within Palestine were given limited rights by the Jews. This arose because a certain universalist tendency now held sway among the Jews of this prophet's time.

Reading II: Romans 11: 13-15, 29-32

God's gifts and calling are given both to Jews and Gentiles. Paul definitely believes this. For him, who was always conscious of his Jewish origins, it became a clear belief that Jews and all others will be saved through God's mercy.

The Gospel: Matthew 15: 21-28

The Canaanite woman is doubly marginal: she is a woman in a man's world and a Gentile. She uses Our Lord's "dog" imagery to make a frank but humble reply. He recognizes the universality of His Father's call; admires the woman's faith, and immediately heals her daughter.

The work of evangelization always begins at home. We are all called to holiness; we are all called to evangelize. But, how can we evangelize if we don't know our faith? Don't have a close relationship with Jesus? We need to be converted within our hearts first and BE evangelized before we do so with others. We cannot reach out to others who do not practice their faith

if we have not heard and accepted the invitation to intimacy with Christ. Those who do not know God cannot bear fruit. We believe our adult faith and formation is an indispensable part of evangelization. Our committee tries to proceed from two viewpoints; one, spiritual development through offering the faithful contact with the rich Tradition of the Catholic Church and spirituality centered in the liturgy and Sacraments. The goal of this development is to cultivate a more authentic and mature relationship with Jesus Christ who is always encountered in and through the Church; two, intellectual/personal development which seeks to enrich a person's knowledge of the Catholic faith so as to enrich and enliven their intimacy with Jesus and allow His love to penetrate all aspects of all our lives. We usually start off with refreshments and community followed by a faithfully Catholic program and ending with faith sharing/questions-answers. The topics are usually related to what is of current or burning interest in our society/culture/family/personal lives.

Over the past 20 plus years of the existence of our committee, we have presented almost 200 programs, some live speakers, some DVD's, some local, some national and usually attended, on average by about 25-30 per program with some over 100 depending on interest. These have served over thousands of parishioners. For the past 12 years we have had a women's scripture study, Walking with Purpose, serve on average 100 women per year for 26 weeks with free baby- sitting- day and evening programs. Not to be outdone, two years ago we started a men's program; our first offering 'That Man is You' had over 40 men attend weekly for 26 weeks; since we have had two others, the Book of St. James and Who am I to Judge serving over 25 men per program for 8-10 weeks each. We are here for you; to serve you so you may serve Him who yearns to be known to all men and women... through you!!!!


St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

"Abortion affects countless marriages more than many people recognize. But there is no doubt that God will bring great healing to those who trust in his infinite mercy. 

How much does a niche cost?

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300

How can I arrange to purchase a niche?

You may contact the Rectory at 215-493-3377 to make an appointment to purchase. Upon final payment, a certificate covering inumment ownership rights will be sent to the purchaser of the niche.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- Spiritual Site for Final Resting The principal benefit a
 Columbarium affords church members and their families the
 opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish
 cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives,
 a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones
 can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.
- Simplicity of Planning The purchase of a Columbarium niche eliminates the pressures of choosing a burial site, casket, vault and monument; also, there is no need to plan for inurnment and memorial services at different locations and times.
- Substantial Financial Savings With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.
