Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 55: 1-3

The Bible frequently uses the symbol of a banquet to celebrate God's care for Israel. Here the banquet is linked with the fulfillment of the covenant that was once made with King David.

Reading II: Romans 8: 35, 37-39

None of life's troubles or pain can make a true Christian forget the love of Christ made manifest in His death and resurrection. Even hostile forces cannot separate us from His love.

The Gospel: Matthew 14: 13-21

After curing the sick, Jesus feeds the people, likely numbering more than 15,000 in total. The blessing and breaking of the bread anticipates the Last Supper, which in turn does the same for the future heavenly banquet.

ADULT *Faith* FORMATION

Now that we are almost 6 months into this pandemic, with no end in sight, many organizations, businesses and individuals are cancelling/postponing events. Our Adult faith formation committee is no different. We had finished our programs for 2020/21 last May and had created a trifold brochure. Now, because of COVID, we are having to look at what it is we can do and where we are going. One thing of which we are certain, there is an ongoing need, perhaps more than ever, for continued catechesis and formation for our parishioners. We will be doing ZOOM meetings for our men's program for the Fall- 8 weeks of videos with small group discussions on Wednesdays at 7 PM. It is not ideal, but the best we can do- Ephesians will be the Book of the Bible, led by Jeff Cavins. Our Saturday programs will be re-arranged and still held on Saturdays at 9 AM- they will be videos and not 'live' speakers. Of course, we will miss the community gatherings/refreshments and in person faith sharing. Some programs may not occur and some events, like the K of C Communion Breakfast scheduled Nov. will not happen because they do not lend themselves to the virtual format. For those who are relegated to 'staying at home' and who stream the Mass perhaps many who are seeking a 'taste' of what the Lord has to offer will 'tune' in through the ZOOM format. See our trifold at the entrances of the Church; go to our parish website where our programs are posted; sign up for "Flocknote" which will place your emails on a secure website that will facilitate contacts for any and all parish information. Finally, pray and then pray some more, especially through the intercession of Mary for an end to this pandemic, perhaps a time of correction, introspection and personal reflection on what is important and what is not.

MISSION APPEAL THIS WEEKEND!

Congregation of the Daughters of Mary, India

The Daughters of Mary Congregation was founded in 1938 by an Indian Missionary Priest, Monsignor Joseph Kuzhinjalil. The main purpose of this Congregation is evangelization through personal contact with the poor.

Around the world thousands of mentally ill brethren, especially women are dangerously suffering in the streets without food, clothing and a safe place to sleep. They depend on the garbage cans of the restaurants for food. They don't brush, shower, or change their clothes. They beg for their living and sleep in the street corners, public parks, railway stations, bus stations and shop corridors. They are subject to abuse, poverty, pain, rejection and despair. Their own family and public alike reject them. Their life ends in the street itself. No one is there to take care of them, or even bury their dead bodies. The municipal workers put their dead bodies in the waste bin and burn it along with the waste. These are the shocking realities of these people. These people are poor, innocent, desperate, and lonely who need our help, care and concern.

Responding to the call of the time, the Sisters of the Congregation of Daughters of Mary, St. Joseph's Province find that it is very urgent to give shelter to the mentally ill women, wandering through the streets, neglected and isolated by family and society.

At present we have three homes for the mentally ill women in the street. The first house has a capacity of 100 women, but we have 118 women in that house.

The second house has 43 woman, but as the house has tiled roof, the Government is not giving license to continue to the ministry. Therefore we are planning to construct a building for them with 50 capacity. We have prepared a proposal for construction of a shelter for these mentally ill women. It would cost about \$400,000. We make mission appeal 2019 for this project.

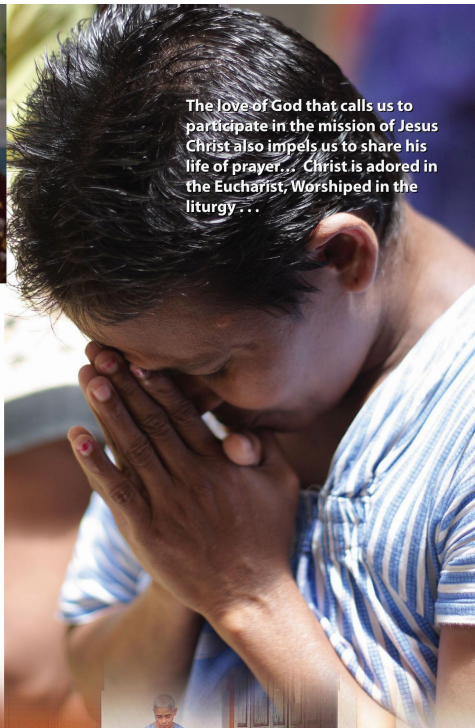
The third house has 23 members, and they are living in an asbestos sheet roofed building. We have given confirmation to the government officials that we will try our best to build a house within a period of five years.

Through your valuable contribution by mission appeal we will be able to support these poor brethren and bring new life in their lives. Thank you so much. May God bless you all.



The congregation of Daughters of Mary was established at Marthandam in 1938, by an Indian missionary priest, Msgr. Joseph Kuzhinjalil. His noble mission was to serve the poor and needy, and to enrich their spiritual and temporal growth.

We are now 1057 religious sisters serving in 160 different locations in India. The main apostolate of the congregation is evangelization through personal contact, and the congregation has initiated many institutions that are now reaching out to hundreds and thousands of poor people.



The love of God that calls us to participate in the mission of Jesus Christ also impels us to share his life of prayer... Christ is adored in the Eucharist; Worshipped in the liturgy...

We walk with the poor and oppressed, those alienated in the society – we respond to the critical needs as hunger and epidemics, natural calamities, broken families and the disvaluing of women, HIV-AIDS affected and infected women and children, leprosy infected families, those oppressed and who lack human rights, and peace. Listen to the homeless people who are heavy hearted, living in hurt, loneliness and anger...
