

August 9, 2020 Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: I Kings 19: 9a, 11-13a

The Lord orders Elijah to act as His servant. Then the Lord teaches the prophet that He comes in a "tiny whisper," and not in the expected ways of wind, earthquake and fire that Elijah might expect.

Reading II: Romans 9: 1-5

Paul laments that the Jews, his own brothers and kinsmen, have not accepted Jesus as the Messiah. Therefore, they have not entered into the new Covenant with Christ.

The Gospel: Matthew 14: 22-33

Jesus' solitary prayer models something for us, namely taking time out for silent solitary prayer each day. Then we hear of Jesus' famous walk on the water, prompting an impulsive Peter to jump in to greet his Lord, only to weaken through doubt. Jesus offers him a helping hand with a smile.

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen



As we approach the feast of the Assumption, one could ponder – do you know what this feast celebrates? Do you know why? Do you know the Holy Days of Obligation? The feast of the Assumption is widely cele-

brated throughout the world. There is a significant difference between the Ascension and the Assumption-Jesus ascended into Heaven under His own authority through that of the Father; Mary was 'assumed' or brought up into Heaven under the authority of the Father, not her own. Although no one know her end (Mary's), many early Church fathers believe that Mary did not die but went into a state of dormition appearing to has died (since the 'wages of sin is death' and Mary was without sin). It wasn't until 1950 that Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of the Church. In the 8th century Pope Leo IV confirmed the feast of the Assumption as 'official'. The Assumption teaches that Mary was taken into Heaven both body and soul to be with Jesus who also is in Heaven in body and soul. The Holy Days of Obligation are January 1- the Feast of Mary, Mother of God; Ascension Thursday, 40 days after Easter; August 15, the Assumption of Mary into Heaven; November 1, All Saints Day; December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary; December 25, the Nativity of Our Lord. These Holy Days are explained in Canon 1246:2 declared on Dec. 13, 1991 by the National Conference of Bishops. The same body has the authority to abolish or move to Sundays these Holy Days. This year, the feast of the Assumption is NOT a holy day of obligation... but pray and honor Mary any-

"Although we may feel unsure how best to comfort those who mourn, we must stand with them in their time of suffering. Miscarriage touches the lives of many people, yet all too often this tragedy remains unaddressed. This lack of response not only

often leads to unresolved grief, but also fails to clearly manifest our belief that each person, from conception onward, is precious and unique."

Much of this 'attitude' results from our morally relativistic comments about early pregnancies being just a 'blob of tissue' and not a living human being. This 'attitude' also emanates from our culture of death and justification for abortion. But, St. JPII tells us in Theology of the Body that the body reveals the 'person'; Jesus 'elevated' the status of the human body by becoming human with His divinity! Each child lost in miscarriage or term still born is the loss of a person, a child, a family member and needs grieving and time to experience loss and should not be relegated to comments like 'you can have another one' or 'you were just early', etc. Whatever you would say to a friend or family member who has lost a loved one either child or adult. We need to 'stand' with them as the disciple John did with Mary at the foot of the Cross and walk with them through their suffering. The same is true, whether wanted or not, with post abortion syndrome and many women, and men, suffer many years from the decision to end the lives of their young children through abortion.


THANK YOU SHOPRITE!

How much does a niche cost?

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following: Burial rights in the niche Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs: To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300

How can I arrange to purchase a niche?

You may contact the Rectory at 215-493-3377 to make an appointment to purchase. Upon final payment, a certificate covering inumment ownership rights will be sent to the purchaser of the niche.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- Spiritual Site for Final Resting The principal benefit a
 Columbarium affords church members and their families the
 opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish
 cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives,
 a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones
 can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.
- Simplicity of Planning The purchase of a Columbarium niche eliminates the pressures of choosing a burial site, casket, vault and monument; also, there is no need to plan for inurnment and memorial services at different locations and times.
- Substantial Financial Savings With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.
