Jesus presents a new law to the people, and a new way of living. His way does not deny but rather fulfills their Jewish inheritance. He also cites six specific examples in His superior ethic.

Seven Founders of the Servite Order Feast Day : February 17th

Can you imagine seven prominent men of Boston or Denver banding together, leaving their homes and professions, and going into solitude for a life directly given to God? That is what happened in the cultured and prosperous city of Florence in the middle of the 13th century. The city was torn with political strife as well as the heresy of the Cathari, who believed that physical reality was inherently evil. Morals were low and religion seemed meaningless.

The time in which the seven Servite founders lived is very easily comparable to the situation in which we find ourselves today. It is "the best of times and the worst of times," as Dickens once wrote. Some, perhaps many, feel called to a countercultural life, even in religion. All of us are faced in a new and urgent way with the challenge to make our lives decisively centered in Christ.

BECOMING A PARISHIONER

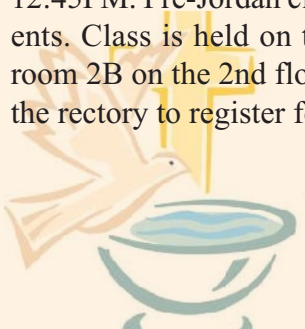
Whether it's your first time here or you have been coming to Mass here for years, we welcome you to join our parish. Please contact the rectory to register.

ADULT Faith FORMATION

Ash Wednesday is Feb. 26, just 10 days from now. So, what is the big deal? Well, this day is a Christian day of prayer, fasting and it derives its name from the placing of repentance ashes on foreheads of participants to either the words ‘repent, and believe in the Gospel’ or ‘remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return’. The concept originated around the 6th century, although its exact origin is not clear. It originated during the papacy of Gregory the Great (590-604). The day prepares us for a season of reflection and preparation before Good Friday- acknowledging the Crucifixion of Our Lord followed by the feast of the Resurrection. We acknowledge what Jesus did before His public ministry by withdrawing to the desert to fast and sacrifice to ‘strengthen’ Him to withstand the three temptations directly from Satan. The ashes represent our earthly mortality, and, while many do not ‘like’ thinking about the fact that they will die and that their bodies will become ‘ash’, they need to go beyond that thought to the knowledge that at the Second Coming of Jesus at the end of the world, everyone will get their resurrected bodies back (we get a glimpse of what that is in the Gospels speaking of Jesus’ appearances after He was resurrected) and will be judged to be in Heavenly communion with the Trinity for all eternity, or, NOT! (hell). Join us next Saturday for our Lenten mini-retreat to prepare. St. Thomas Aquinas, pray for us.

Life “Prayer is the foundation of all that we do in defense of human life. Our efforts—whether educational, pastoral, or legislative—will be less than fully fruitful if we do not change hearts and if we do not ourselves overcome our own spiritual blindness. Only with prayer—prayer that storms the heavens for justice and mercy, prayer that cleanses our hearts and our souls—will the culture of death that surrounds us today be replaced with a culture of life.” We need to have the ‘scales fall from our eyes’ as with St. Paul. We need to open the door to our hearts- as noted in Hunt’s “Light of the World”; may it also be noted from that painting that the door has long be ‘unopened’ and the door has no external ‘latch/knob’, it can only be opened from within- by us! So, this Lenten season, as a reminder of every Lent, Jesus is knocking; He is seeking us; He comes to us, every day in the Eucharist; He gives us sacraments/grace/ a call to ‘communion’/ His Word (Bible) and yet the world is so noisy with everyday life that we don’t hear Him and, sometimes, we do but don’t respond. Let us retreat to solitude, silence and prayerful listening and say ‘yes’ as Mary did.

The Columbarium

at St. Ignatius of Antioch Cemetery

For many centuries cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members, from baptism through life to death. Since our cemetery is nearly at capacity today, we cannot offer additional burial plots at our parish cemetery. But there is a modern alternative which more and more churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns containing cremated human remains (cremains). Inscribed with the persons' names and dates of birth and death. St. Ignatius' Columbarium is located in our parish cemetery on the picturesque Delaware River. The Columbarium is self-funded, using income derived from the sale of niches for construction and operation.

Benefits of a Columbarium

- *Spiritual Site for Final Resting* - The principal benefit a Columbarium affords church members and their families the opportunity to select their final resting place in the parish cemetery of the church which has been central to their lives, a sacred site of beauty and dignity where their loved ones can visit and meditate whenever they visit the cemetery.

- *Substantial Financial Savings* - With the Columbarium, significant costs are limited to cremation, the niche, the plaque and the obituary.

How much does a niche cost?

Pricing of Outdoor Columbarium Niches and Services are as follows:

Two Center Rows - \$3,000
 Row Above and Below the Center Rows - \$2,750
 Top and Bottom Row - \$2,500

The purchase of an Outdoor Columbarium Niche includes the following:
 Burial rights in the niche
 Perpetual care

Opening and closing costs:
 To be paid upon interment of Cremated Remains
 Monday – Friday: \$250 Saturday: \$300
