February 2, 2020 Presentation of the Lord

Reading I: Malachi 3: 1-4

The “messenger,” (which is what “Malachi” means in English), speaks in the fourth of six oracles about the coming of the Lord to the Temple, and what it will mean. There will be future judgment that will result in a purification of the people.

Reading II: Hebrews 2: 14-18

A convincing reason for Jesus to share in our human nature was that by experiencing suffering and death He was able to destroy the devil and free us from the slavery involved in fearing death.

The Gospel: Luke 2: 22-40, or 2: 22-32

Luke lets us “meet” two holy people, “senior citizens” if you will, whose lives were centered around the Temple: Simeon and Anna. Simeon’s request to live to see the Messiah was answered on the day of Jesus’ presentation, and so he can recite his “Nunc Dimittis,” i.e. “Now you may dismiss your servant.” Meanwhile the holy widow Anna speaks about this Child, Jesus, as the personification of Israel’s hope.

BECOMING A PARISHIONER

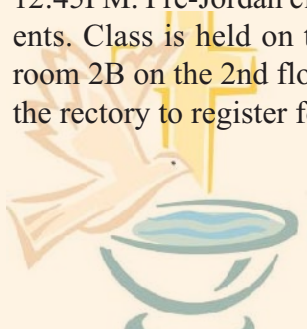
Whether it's your first time here or you have been coming to Mass here for years, we welcome you to join our parish. Please contact the rectory to register.

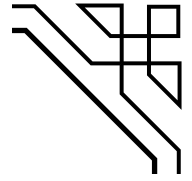
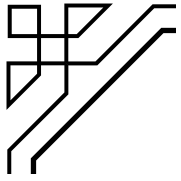

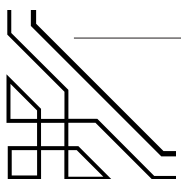
