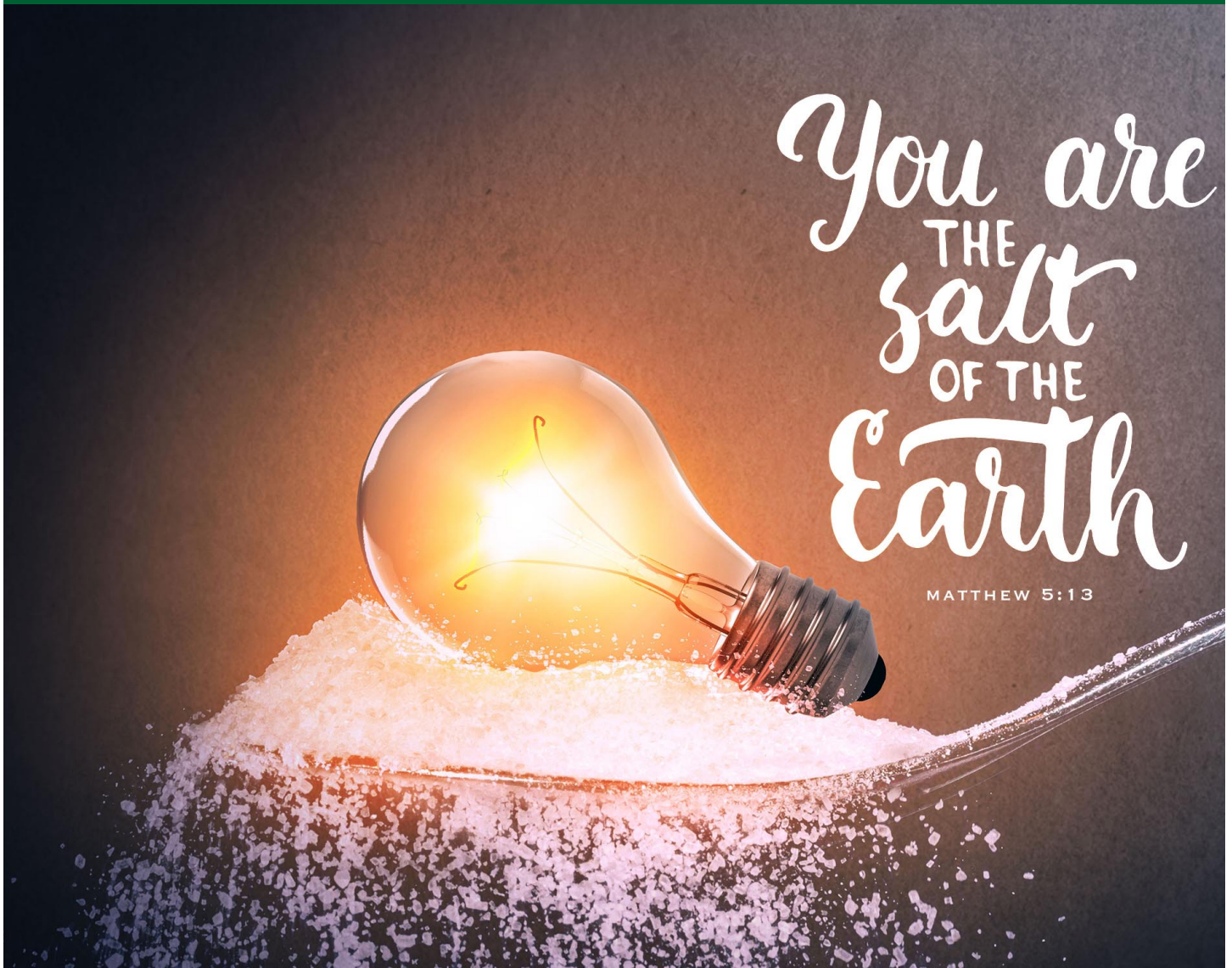

February 9, 2020 Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 58: 7-10

The writer unknowingly anticipates Matthew's gospel scene of the last Judgment, when the kindly acts mentioned here are the basis for judging how well we treated the poor and oppressed in our lifetimes.

Reading II: I Corinthians 2: 1-5

Paul focuses on the crucified Christ in his preaching as he admits to his weakness and fear as a preacher. But he also tells them he relies on the power of God for his task, and that they should do the same when their newfound belief is challenged.

Gospel: Matthew 5: 13-16

The two metaphors of salt and light make for good teaching aids for Jesus. They had a genuine importance in the daily lives of people in the ancient world. Salt remains a preservative, and light is still most precious in the darkness of the long night.

Scholastica and Benedict gave themselves totally to God and gave top priority to deepening their friendship with him through prayer. In coming closer to Christ, however, they found they were also closer to each other. In joining a religious community, they did not forget or forsake their family but rather found more brothers and sisters.

BECOMING A PARISHIONER

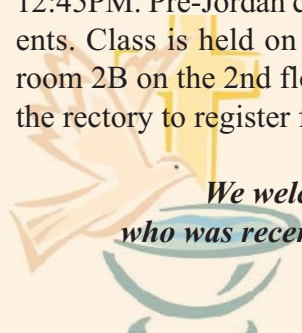
Whether it's your first time here or you have been coming to Mass here for years, we welcome you to join our parish. Please contact the rectory to register.

FISCAL CORNER

As you know, we are using Parish Giving for our online e-giving program. They are the leading provider of secure, user-friendly online giving systems specializing in religious and charitable organizations. This past week we had 106 regular weekly contributions using our online giving program for a total of \$3,739! Additional Bi-weekly and monthly contributions totaling \$2,065 were also made by 22 participants, as well as a special \$5,000 one time contribution for a total of \$10,804. We had a total of 128 families participating on our electronic giving program this past week!

Those participating in online giving have found the program to be more convenient and allows them to maintain full control over their account.

We Thirst: Christian Reflections on Addiction

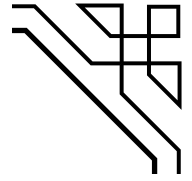
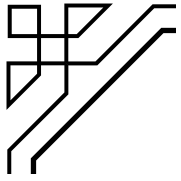

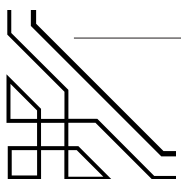
